Bishop Driesen has retired to York and is enjoying his time closer to family. We will join together for lunch following the combined liturgy on Sunday June 3rd. in our newly refurbished Social Hall.



On behalf of the Congregation Council, I want to thank everyone who submitted feedback to our survey about service times and the needs of President's Report our parish. The response rate was great! Many comments were positive, thoughtful, and attentive to the needs of our faith community. In terms of service time preferences, there was not a strong majority who prefer one or two services. In fact, the data was split nearly 50/50 on the matter. Those preferring one service noted the strong sense of unity and en-

ergy that we have carried over the past few months. Those recommending two services appreciated service time options and noted parking limitations.

Without a majority consensus, the Council reviewed other sources of data to help make the best decision for the future of St. Paul's. First, our weekly attendance has averaged around 170 worshipers over the past two months. With 225 seats on the floor of the nave, we are at 75% capacity. Best practices suggest expanding services when attendance reaches these levels. Next, we have historical data that shows poor attendance/offerings through single-service summer months. Finally, we see significant growth potential at St. Paul's. While many Lutheran Churches are struggling, we have been blessed with many new members! Weakening mainline Protestant church attendance was a topic of conversation at our January retreat, and we must be wise in mitigating these effects on our congregation. With these and other considerations in mind, the Council confidently decided to move to two services, beginning June 10th.

This isn't a decision to "go back" to two services, but one that "looks forward" to new opportunities. Much has changed since we began Building in Faith for Future Generations, and we must be creative in developing new opportunities for growth. If you have appreciated the sense of unity and energy around St. Paul's during this season of one worship service, as I have, please join with us in carrying that forward through the summer and new seasons beyond. I think that the time between services will become increasingly important to sustaining our strong sense of community, and I hope to see you *all* then on June $10^{\text{in}!}$

Moving Forward with Two Sunday Services

Beginning June 10th

In order to meet the needs of our growing congregation there will be two options for Sunday worship at St. Paul's and many opportunities for fellowship. The information garnered from the worship survey was extremely helpful in bringing clarity and focus to our mission and



ministry. Our limited amount of convenient parking was identified. The joy of meeting people and getting better aquatinted through fellowship opportunities was also identified. While it has been an absolute joy to have the church nave filled every Sunday it is important for guests and visitors to know that there is room for them at St. Paul's. These three things were also communicated by Pastor Richard Jorgenson, ELCA Director for Evangelical Mission, and Assistant to the Lower Susquehanna Synod Bishop when he met with me in April.

The question has been raised if the two services will be identical. The answer to the questions is an easy one, no. The services have always been different. The early liturgy at 8:00 a.m. will be structured much like the summer liturgies held last summer. It is designed to play to the strengths of the worshipping community at that morning hour. At 8:00 a.m. we will sing the Hymn of the Day. There will be a children's sermon. The service will continue to be a traditional liturgy of Word and Sacrament. We will continue to commune with hosts and the option of intinction or common chalice. We plan to return to using common loaf of bread when the construction is complete and the Altar Guild has access to a fully functioning sacristy. We will need a complete ensemble of lay assistants, ushers, and greeters.

The 10:30 a.m. liturgy will remain very similar to what we have been experiencing at 9:15 a.m. As we approach the long green season, Sundays after Pentecost, the liturgy will be a bit simpler than it has been during the joyful season of Easter. A children's sermon will be included. The entrance rite and Eucharistic Prayer will be shorter. Communion will be distributed in the same fashion as at 8:00 a.m. and we will utilize a few more hymns. We will need a complete ensemble of lay assistants, ushers, and greeters for this liturgy too!

The hope is that volunteers will sign up to sponsor fellowship time which will follow the 8:00 a.m. service and precede the one at 10:30 a.m. Worshipers will be encouraged to linger after the early liturgy and those attending the later liturgy are encouraged to arrive early to share in conversation and fellowship. A new space in which to gather on the Springettsbury side of the building should be ready for use by early summer. The sofas and chairs that used to grace the south end of the chapel will find a new home in the newly created gathering space. They will once again provide comfortable seating. This should create an environment for fellowship that was identified through the worship surveys. A sign-up sheet will be circulated on Sunday mornings prior to worship if you are so moved to contribute to this aspect of ministry.

Please make every effort to attend one of the two service offerings each Sunday. And please do sit toward the front of the nave as attendance will seem a bit sparse after having a combined service for these first five months of 2018. As we move into this renewed schedule may you meet new people, make new friends, and grow more deeply in God's love and generous forgiveness.

TEACHING THE FAITH TO CHILDREN

At a child's baptism, the parents make promises to "faithfully bring their child to the services of God's house, and teach them the Lord's Prayer and the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. To place in their hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for their instruction in the Christian faith so they may lead godly lives until the day of Jesus Christ. " (taken from the order for baptism in the Lutheran Book of Worship)



These are big promises and sometimes hard to keep. The most important thing parents can do to keep this promise is to regularly bring their child to worship where they can hear the stories from the Bible and be fed with the body and blood of Christ through the Holy Eucharist. But what else can we do?

Pray together before meals.

- During the summer months, when schedules slow down and warm weather is calling us out to explore the world, take time to thank God as a family for all that He has given us. Take creation walks and collect things that God has made. Take pictures and create a slide show of things you are thankful for.
- Before and after sports games, talk about how your behavior and attitude can reflect how Jesus is part of your life.
- Use the stories and activities in your **Quarterly Spark Family Magazine** that comes to your child at home. This magazine is purchased by the Christian Education Committee and provided to you to aid in your reading, teaching and exploring God's Holy Word as a family. We are beginning the third year of providing this magazine for families. If you are not receiving this in your home, please call Patee at the church office so that your name is added to the list.
