Required Minimum Distributions RMD

As we near the end of the year, individuals who over 70 1/2 with IRAs need to review their current status regarding their Required Minimum Distribution to insure compliance with tax law. If you have not met the RMD yet, you may be able to save some income tax payment by making a Qualified Charitable Contribution from their IRA. If the Distribution is made payable to a charity, e.g. St Paul's Lutheran Church, the amount counts toward your RMD and will reduce the taxable amount of the RMD. Your financial representative can assist in the process.

Church offering envelopes for the 2019 calendar year will be available in early December. They will be ready for pick up in the Good Shepherd Room. Please make every effort to collect your packet. The envelopes are in a tablet form so that each week's envelope can simply be torn out and brought with you to worship or simply mailed to the office if you aren't able to attend. The hymn which dates to the 4th century and is attributed to St. Ambrose has shaped Advent worship for Christians throughout the ages. In 1523 Martin Luther prepared a literal translation of the text for his German speaking community. Later, J. S. Bach wrote four organ settings of the plain-song tune and included the melody in Cantatas 36 and 62. The hymn remains a staple for Lutheran Advent worship. Join us in hearing the beautiful melodic melody of this Advent hymn and add your voice in singing

Savior of the nations, come; Show the glory of the Son! Every people, stand in awe; Praise the perfect Son of God.

In the early 1940's when the current church edifice was in its final stages of completion the congregation published a gift list, actually it was a professionally published booklet with artist renderings of items needed to complete the structure and to make it fully inhabitable. It listed everything from pulpit and altar to window treatments and everything else imaginable that the construction contract did not cover or provide. As we approach the final stages of completion of our fully renovated building there are many things that the construction contract did not cover or provide but which are critical to make our house of worship, education and social outreach fully inhabitable. What follows is a simple gift list. It is not elaborately published. It doesn't contain artist renderings but all of the items are needed. Annual Meeting Re-Cap

The congregation gathered for the regularly scheduled meeting on Sunday November 18 following the 10:30 AM liturgy. The Fellowship Committee provided refreshments. Tim Yakim, Vice-President called the meeting to order. Opening Prayer was offered by Pastor Reep. The minutes from the 2016 and 2017 Annual Meetings were adopted as presented in the 2018 Bulletin of Reports. The Vice-President identified four appointments to Congregation Council all of which are for one year. Those appointed are: Nancy Bennett, Dan Garber, Kathleen Lempke, and Kathryn Wicker. A unanimous ballot was cast electing: Patty Snyder and Kem Vaught to 3 year term Congregation Council; Becky Bingham to a 3 Year term on Benevolence Committee; Peter Hartmann, Rhada Hartmann, and Andrew Doughty voting members to the 2019 Synod Assembly; Tim Yakim and Carolyn Kaupon to 3 year term Mutual Ministry. Kem Vaught provided an up-date on the church renovation construction project. The next item for business was the presentation of the 2019 operating budget by Tony Culp, Treasurer. A Budget of \$789,037 was adopted. In order to complete the renovations an additional \$600,000 is needed. It was approved to secure the amount from York Traditions Bank with the same terms that are currently associated with the 3 million dollar construction loan. Oral reports were given by: Larry Moore for the Food Pantry, Nicki Herdson for the Preschool, Martina Uffelman for the Mpogus Committee, Tom Gibson for the Boy Scouts, Patty Snyder for Christian Education, Kristine Gross for Worship and Arts and Pastor Reep on ministry and the congregation's bright future.
