




Food Pantry January 2019

Council Highlights

The Congregational Council met for its monthly meeting on Monday, December 10th. The Building Renewal Project and the Capital Campaign status were primary talking points. We understand that the elevator will not be installed until sometime in (probably late) January, primarily because the installer requires the shaft to be 100% ready, and because they have a busy schedule. The news of work continuing into 2019 is unwelcome, but we see signs of completion throughout the building. The light of the end is visible!

We were encouraged by an immediate response to our Capital Campaign Update cards. Several cards were received in the offering on the first day they were available! Among them were at least one new contributor and several extended gifts totaling \$16,000. This is obviously great news, but there is still a ways to go before we reach our goal. To understand that goal in simple terms, remember one date and one figure. The date is August 2020. The figure is \$2,000,000. If we can reduce our mortgage debt to that amount by that time, we have trust income that will handle the principal and interest of a mortgage loan. The congregation would essentially be "off the hook" if we reduce our construction debt to \$2M by August 2020. We are focused on covering expenses above that (roughly \$1.6M) through the Capital Campaign and fundraisers. If we are all willing to sacrifice now to reach that mark, our ministries will be able to thrive unaffected.

We held officer elections and look forward to installment of the following officers on January 6th at 10:30 AM:

President: Tristan Ericson Vice-President: Tim Yakim Secretary: Kathryn Wicker

Treasurer: Tony Culp

Finally, the Council set plans for its annual retreat on February 23rd for leadership building, vision formation, and long-range planning. The Executive Committee also plans to reform its meetings to focus on the broader goals of the parish. It remains an exciting time at St. Paul's, with new visitors, renovated spaces, strong Sunday School attendance, and increased ministry capacity.

The Way of the Cross, Organ & Art

Good Friday, April 19, 2019 beginning at Noon.

Our organist Victor Fields will present a music and art depiction on the Way of the Cross. This will feature a 14 movement virtuosic organ work Le Chemin de la Croix - "The Way of the Cross" by the 20th French virtuoso organist and composer Marcel Dupré considered one of the greatest organists of all time. Artwork shown on a projection screen will accompany the dramatic music. This 70 minute presentation will allow you to reflect on the drama and passion that our Lord Jesus endured on the way to the Cross. This music is rarely heard and seldom played, so it will be a way to guide you through Good Friday during Holy Week.

In the early 1940's when the current church edifice was in its final stages of completion the congregation published a gift list, actually it was a professionally published booklet with artist renderings of items needed to complete the structure and to make it fully inhabitable. It listed everything from pulpit and altar to window treatments and everything else imaginable that the construction contract did not cover or provide. As we approach the final stages of completion of our fully renovated building there are many things that the construction contract did not cover or provide but which are critical to make our house of worship, education and social outreach fully inhabitable. What follows is a simple gift list. It is not elaborately published. It doesn't contain artist renderings but all of the items are needed. Please prayerfully consider how you can provide one or more of the items needed. Costs are estimates.

ADA electric range for main level kitchen \$1,000

ADA dishwasher for main level kitchen \$1,000

ADA electric range for upper level preschool kitchenette \$1,000

Refrigerator for the upper level youth room \$800

Washer and electric dryer for the lower level sexton workroom \$1,200

Window treatments for the main level nursery \$2,150

Window treatments for the main level music suite \$3,560

Window treatments for the upper level red room \$2,600

Window treatments for the upper level yellow room \$2,700

Window treatments for the lower level community rooms \$3,000

Window treatments for the lower level Food Pantry and workroom/office \$4,200


Public address system for the church nave \$36,000
