

York Conference Confirmation Ministry February 10, Winter Sessions Begins







Council Report

A significant part of the January Congregation Council meeting was devoted to organizational matters. Committee liaisons were determined, opening and closing prayer dates were selected. President Ericson presented his goals for the Council during 2019 as well as some adjustments to be made to the way Council would conduct its business.



The treasurer's report showed very favorable results for the income side of the full year. After lagging for much of the year, envelope giving ended well above budget as a result of very good giving in December. Trust income was also above expectations.

above budget as a result of very good giving in December. Trust income was also above expectations. Committees kept their expenses in line with their budgets. The final results still need to be reviewed to be certain that all items have been correctly accounted for.

The Council made some decisions about its annual retreat with committee chairs. The retreat will be held at Spiritrust Lutheran Village at Sprenkle Drive in February 23. The proposed agenda was distributed and will be discussed at length at the February meeting.

Pastor Reep's report included statistics about attendance at Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services since 2005. The Christmas Eve 7 PM service had the highest attendance in decades. There has been a strong upward trend in the Christmas Eve services while Christmas Day has declined by about a third. This information will be included in a review of Christmas worship by the Worship Committee.


