#### Wednesday Morning Bible Study

This letter as we have come to know it is broken into 6 chapters. We will discover why Paul gets so angry and frustrated with the Christians in Galatia, what he proposes as a solution to rectify the troubling congregation and what hope this brings to us. We will again hear of the fruit of the Spirit; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Please join us as we meet to feast on God's word made known to us in holy scripture.

#### The Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly

The Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly will be held at Messiah College on June 6-8. St. Paul's voting members are Andrew Doughty, Peter and Rhada Hartmann, and Pastor Reep. As the assembly provides opportunity to gather for worship, prayer, edification and business, this year is unique for it is the year in which we elect a bishop. The process of preparing for the assembly and the election of a bishop began more than a year ago. Our York Conference met twice in preparation for the June Assembly. Our current bishop, The Rev. James Dunlop, is willing to stand (serve) for another term (6 years) if he is reelected. However this is an ecclesiastical ballot, meaning that any ELCA Rostered Pastor in good standing could be considered, nominated, and even elected to serve as Bishop of the Lower Susquehanna Synod. Many names have been identified of Pastors who have the qualities sought after for the office of Bishop. So as you can imagine this will be a rather exciting assembly to attend. You can witness much of the assembly through the synod's web site as the proceedings are live streamed. Do keep our voting members, the synod, and our bishop and his staff in prayer throughout these days of meetings.

St. Paul's is seeking a part-time custodian. The 10 hour per week position will provide support during the preschool year, two hours per day.
