Wine Harvest Dinner and Art Auction October 19, 2019 5:30 PM

Plans are well underway for the Wine Harvest Dinner and Art Auction to be held in our newly renovated Fellowship Hall on Saturday October 19 at 5:30 PM. The Capital Campaign Committee continues seeking ways for us to narrow the gap between actual construction costs and the amount to be converted into a mortgage. The dinner and action is one such opportunity for us to raise money which will go toward the expenses associated with the upgrades to the Food Pantry ministry. This ministry is essential for many who reside in our local neighborhood.



The Food Pantry is rapidly moving to its 40th year of service to the community. Renovation costs associated with the pantry and entrance ramp were estimated at \$230,000. At this point we have received a grant of \$4,000 from the ELCA and Lower Susquehanna Synod to purchase a new commercial refrigeration unit and a new freezer unit, \$23,000 grant from the Powder Mill Foundation, and \$8,993 from 2019 Calendar sales. A quick calculation indicates that this ministry to support the York community still needs a tremendous amount of financial support.



The Harvest Dinner is being prepared by guest chef Brandon Hufnagel of The Glen Rock Mill Inn. The menu will feature locally sourced ingredients from his family farm and from farms in close proximity to Glen Rock. Each course will be complimented by a carefully selected wine. Following the dinner, winners of the silent auction items will be announced, and a live auction with paintings donated by Pastor Reep (depicted in the 2019 calendar) will ensue. It should be a delightful evening. All proceeds from the evening support the renovations for the Food Pantry. There are a limited number of tickets available. The cost per ticket for the dinner is \$100. The tickets are available from members of the Capital Campaign Committee and through the Church office. Checks should be made payable to St. Paul's Lutheran Church with "dinner" in the memo line. Tickets to the dinner and auction event supporting the work of The Food Pantry make perfect gifts for Mother's Day, Birthday and Wedding Anniversaries, or other special occasions.



The current membership of the Columbarium committee is Tom Ruth, chairman, Pastor Reep, Bob Little, Ron Sturges and Larry Gross, all of whom will be glad to answer your questions and/or help you with the documentation should your choice be cremation and internment in our Garden of Memory.

Having your "end of life decisions" made, properly documented, and communicated to your loved ones is one of the best gifts you can provide them in their time of grief.


Food Pantry May 2019


