


Online Devotions Group

While lighting an advent wreath each week, they will talk about waiting. Waiting for Jesus birthday, waiting for Jesus to come to us in the Eucharist each week and waiting for Jesus to come again.

Youth in grades 5-7 and up have enjoyed discussing matters of faith with Miss Kelly.

December 1, 9:15-10:15AM Advent Breakfast and Learning for all ages

Join us for a morning of fellowship, food and fun. Following breakfast, the children will share their Jesse Tree ornaments that they have made on Tuesday nights. We will also learn about opportunities to GIVE during this Advent Season.

What is a Jesse Tree? Who was Jesse? Jesse was King David's father. In the Old Testament, in the book of Isaiah, we read "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesus is descended from King David and from Jesse. The tradition of using a Jesse Tree during Advent helps us to remember how many of the stories from the Bible are related and how they relate to Jesus. Each ornament represents a different Bible story and can be used as part of daily devotions for individuals or families.

These newly renovated spaces make the hunger ministry better meet the needs of clients through accessibility, and improved refrigeration for fresh produce, and the learning ministry safer, friendlier, and more convenient for students and their families.

Council Highlights

The Congregation Council gathered for their regular meeting on Monday November 11 at 7:00 PM in Christ Hall. Opening prayer moved quickly into a time of devotion highlighting the Biblical story from Numbers of Balaam, the donkey, and the angel.



The Agenda for the Annual Meeting was approved.

Thank you cards were prepared for those who helped with the Harvest Wine Dinner.

A building use policy was presented and adopted.

The Nominations Committee reported: **Congregation Council** – Ellen Doughty, Tristan Ericson, Dan Garber, Nancy Bennett, Kathleen Lemke, & Kathryn Wicker **Benevolence Committee** – Melissa Yakim **Synod Voting Member** – Andrew Doughty **Mutual Ministry Committee** –

An evacuation plan was presented by the Property Committee. It reflects the building as it is currently configured. Tim Yakim will order new frames for the site maps and the property committee will arrange for their installation throughout the building.

The Property Committee met with Sage, the company originally presenting bid for a new public address system in the church nave, narthex, gathering space and nursery. The cost remains at nearly \$30,000. A less expensive model was explored. The committee however unanimously agreed that the original plan is still the best option and does not think we should compromise on the quality of sound when purchasing a new public address system. We will continue to seek out designated gifts for this project.

The Finance Committee reported their findings on a possible mortgage for the congregation and how to arrive at the desired mortgage amount through Capital Campaign gifts and utilization of a portion of the Investment Portfolio.

The Council approved the Worship and Arts Committee recommendation that one Sunday liturgy be held at 9:15 AM during the summer months of June, July and August 2020.

The Council approved the Troup #19 Eagle Scout projects: Fire/Flower Pit & Hygiene Kits. The Property Committee and Social Ministry Committee reviewed each project.

The Council approved the Social Ministry Committee's request for the Advent mid-week offering to be added to the Sunday school children's offerings for the ELCA God's Global Barnyard. The campaign concludes on January 26, 2020.

The meeting concluded with prayer by Tony Culp. The meeting adjourned at 8:45 PM.

Take Charge of Your Health Care Planning

There are many things in life that are out of our hands. However, you can and should have a say about your health care wishes. This is especially important when you become critically ill and lose the ability to speak for yourself. One way to direct your health care is to put it in writing. This can be done using a document called an Advance Directive. Specifically, Five Wishes

Is a very useful form, on file here at the church, that lets you say exactly what you want. Once completed you give copies to the person you designate to make decisions on your behalf, your health care providers, and hospitals you use. Just want some information about Advance Directives? There is a "Fast Facts" form explaining the components. Want something that can help you get the word out about your documented wishes to family and friends? The "Listen to Me" form will do that. If you have questions about Advance Directives, please see Rhada Hartmann.

Garden of Memory- On November 1, 2009 we celebrated the completion of the columbarium on the corner of our property at S. George Street and Springettsbury Avenue, making an improvement to both the neighborhood and our beautiful grounds. Responsible stewardship of the creation God gave us grows, making cremation a popular choice for the "end of life" decisions. It is not or ever will be our intent to make a profit from this service. The intent is to offer an affordable and dignified alternative to current members, former members, and faithful friends. As the pricing was in 2009, it remains the same today, ranging from \$250 to \$1500. If you have spiritual concerns regarding cremation Pastor Reep (717-843-8155) will personally meet with you to answer your questions. Should you want to pursue the details of this service, we have a packet of information that will be provided to you by calling the church office to pick up or have it sent (717-843-8155). The current membership of the Columbarium committee is Tom Ruth, Pastor Reep, Bob Little, Ron Sturges and Larry Gross, all of whom will be glad to answer your questions and/or help you with the documentation should your choice be cremation and internment in our Garden of Memory.

Minimum Required Distribution

As we near the end of the year, individuals who are over 70 1/2 with IRAa need to review their current status regarding meeting their Minimum Required Distribution to insure compliance with tax law. If you have not met the MRD yet, you may be able to save some income tax payment by making a Qualified Charitable Contribution from their IRA. If the Distribution is made payable to a charity, e.g. St Paul's Lutheran Church, the amount counts toward your MRD and will reduce the taxable amount of the MRD. Your financial representative can assist in the process. This is just another way to be a good steward with what has been entrusted to you. Thank you.
