# **Entering and Leaving the Church:**

Monetary offerings may be placed in the basins provided at the entrances to the nave prior to the service or immediately following the service. You may also donate via our website at www.stpaulsyork.org

#### While in the Nave:

**Please wear your mask.** Please sit in designated pews only. You may sit together as a family. We ask that you practice social distancing from one family to the next within the pew.

#### Communion Procedure:

- Ushers will direct you. The pulpit side (left) of the nave communes first followed by the font side (right).
- Wearing your face mask, come to the chancel step taking your place at one of the five positions marked on the chancel floor with a green cross.
- Your entire household may gather at a position marked by the green cross.
- Extend your arms and cup your hands together to receive the host.
- Please do not reach out to take the Host from the minister.
- Once the minister has moved to the next group, then remove your mask, receive the host, replace your mask and return to your pew by the closest side aisle. There is no need to hurry.
- We are receiving communion in one kind only (bread/host).

At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit.


By water and your Word you claim us as daughters and sons, making us heirs of your promise and servants of all.

In the hope of new life in Christ, we raise our prayers to you, trusting in your neverending goodness and mercy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.



# Wednesday Bible Study The Book of Acts

Wednesday Bible Study is held at 10:30 AM in Christ Hall. During the season of Easter the first reading each Sunday is from the book of Acts. We will spent a portion of our time together gaining greater insight into the book of Acts while still spending time reflecting on the Easter gospel readings. The Acts of the Apostles is a continuation of the narrative of the Gospel according to Luke. The book of Acts can be divided into two large portions. The first portion centers on Peter and deals with the early church in Jerusalem in the days following the resurrection of Jesus. The second portion centers on Paul and deals with his three missionary journeys and the expansion of the message of Christ crucified, raised and ascended. These readings direct our Sunday worship during this joyous season of Easter with a duel focus on the good news that God has raised Jesus from death to life and in our missionary effort to tell and share the good news with others here and around the world. "Lord. What do you want me to say to your people? What is that is burning deep within you that you would have me say to your faithful who have gathered?" These are the kinds of questions and the conversations that the Reverend Adam Smallbone of St. Saviour's Church, a fictitious congregation in East London, often has with the Lord God as presented in the TV series REV.

Father Adam in an altruistic way wants to advance the gospel of our Lord, wants to model the ministry of Jesus, and yet when he does he perpetually gets put down by; parishioners, the vestry, co-workers, the Arch-Deacon and Bishop even the clerk at the local convenience store. It seems that both the secular world and the religious institution is against the very salvation that Jesus brings by his death and resurrection. The biblical texts seem at times to be so crystal clear, and when they are Father Adam tries to live into them. And when they aren't, then Father Adam breaks into a personal conversational prayer with the Lord. His prayers usually go a bit like this.

"Lord," Father Adam begins.

I never really know what to say. Why are you using me? I am rather ordinary. I haven't excelled at much that is recognized by the world as significant. I know that when your servants Peter and John stepped out following the resurrection the things that they said and did got them in a heap of trouble with the religious authorities. I am not looking for trouble, Lord. I don't much like getting people worked up. You said that time on the mountain that peace makers were to be blessed. But so much of what your servants have done seem to cause commotion.

Yes, Lord, such situations have brought many to faith. This morning alone if we read on a bit from the sacred text we discover that five thousand believed in you that day. That certainly must have made the religious leaders sit up and take notice. Lord, is that why they questioned Peter and John about "power" and the "name" in which that poor lame man was restored to health? Is that what threatened them, made them so uneasy about their own positions, a lame man walking?

I pray, that like Peter, when we speak of you and your love and compassion, your grace and mercy, that we are filled with the Holy Spirit. Use our voices to boldly proclaim something other than what we hear so much about in the news, about worldly power and authority and name. Most people will know more about the international stage than about you. North Korea tests missals. Russia silences the voice of Alexa Navally. Iran enriches uranium. China expands into the South China Sea. Lord, why is it that political and military power is muscling its way to the top and your salvation and name seem to go unnoticed? Is it because I haven't been bold enough? That's it Lord, people like me, we haven't been bold in the same way that Peter and John were bold.

People come to us wanting things and you offer life. Like that day when the lame man was restored. He was at the gate of the temple and he wanted money. In your name he was given life. The way he jumped around it was abundant life. Oh, so that is

it, it isn't about things, it is about relationship. Relationship, like the one created, formed, advanced when that man stood with Peter and John who testified that it was in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth that he was restored.

Isn't that the way it is for us too? We come to you wanting things and you give us life. In baptism you restore broken relationships, forgive the horrible things we have done, are doing, and will most likely keep on doing because of our sinfulness. But, Lord, you keep forgiving us, claiming us, coming after us when we go astray. Oh, so that's why you are the Good Shepherd. You keep coming after us when we go astray. You aren't like the other guys who are hired to tend and care for us and who will run off as soon as there is any sign of danger.

The sacred text uses "wolf" coming after us, but to be truthful I am more concerned about so many other dangers prevalent; world leaders building up their arsenals to instill fear and wreak havoc, depression that leads to suicide, children who don't have adequate drinking water or daily nutrition, prejudice drawing lines to keep people apart, racism spewing false information to keep some down and to keep some on top. But in all of this you remain the One Shepherd leading us along right paths, beside still waters and through dark valleys. Yes Lord, I heard you say all those things about who you are and what you do. I can recite them. You say:

I am the good shepherd.

I know my own and my own know me.

I know the Father.

I lay down my life.

I have other sheep.

I must bring them.

I have power.

I have received this command.

But Lord, I hear that you are the gate, the entrance, the one calling to us to lead us and save us and give us life in abundance. I have been busy focusing on things and you are busy making a way for your beloved flock, not saturated with stuff, but saturated with acceptance, love, release from what holds us so that life, real life, abundant life in you may abound. It was Peter who told the crowd that day that "there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved."

Saved. That's why you lay down your life, died on a cross, so that there would be one flock, one shepherd. I think I get it Lord. I spend too much time focusing on the "wolves" and the "things" when I need to focus on you the One Shepherd who gives abundant life. Help me get the word out. Use my voice and my life so that others will boldly stand with Peter and John proclaiming your power and name. Amen.

#### FIRST READING: Acts 4:5-12

The next day [the] rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, <sup>6</sup> with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. 7When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" 8Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, 9if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, 10let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. 11 This Jesus is

'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders;

it has become the cornerstone.

# GOSPEL: John 10:11-18

[Jesus said:] "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. 12 The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. <sup>13</sup>The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. 14I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, 15 just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. 16I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. <sup>17</sup> For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. 18 No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."
