Holy Saturday/Vigil of Easter

The Vigil of Easter begins with a new fire. We gather at the Garden of Memory. Here from this place associated with death we begin the third portion of the Triduum. The Vigil of Easter is the first celebration of our Lord's Resurrection. We move from the Garden of Memory into the darkened church where we hear salvation history recounted through a series of readings from Holy Scripture. The sacrament of Holy Baptism is celebrated. Prayers are offered. We make the transition from darkness to light, from death to resurrection as the first hymn of Easter is sung. The Easter gospel is read, Holy Communion celebrated and we joyfully take our leave anticipating the full glorious celebration of Easter on Sunday morning.

Guidelines for Worship during the time of COVID-19

Entering and Leaving the Church:

Face masks are required inside,

Kindly sign in at the door through which you entered. This will help if we need to be in contact. Please take your service bulletin with you and dispose of it properly.

Offerings:

Monetary offerings may be placed in the basins provided at the entrances to the nave prior to the service or immediately following the service. You may also donate via our website at www.stpaulsyork.org

While in the Nave:

Please wear your mask. Please sit in designated pews only. You may sit together as a family. We ask that you practice social distancing from one family to the next within the pew.

Communion Procedure:

- Ushers will direct you. The pulpit side (left) of the nave communes first followed by the font side (right).
- Wearing your face mask, come to the chancel step taking your place at one of the five positions marked on the chancel floor with a green cross.
- Your entire household may gather at a position marked by the green cross.
- Extend your arms and cup your hands together to receive the host.
- Please do not reach out to take the Host from the minister.
- Once the minister has moved to the next group, then remove your mask, receive the host, replace your mask and return to your pew by the closest side aisle. There is no need to hurry.
- We are receiving communion in one kind only (bread/host).

VIGIL OF EASTER APRIL 3, 2021—7:00 PM

The People gather at the Garden of Memory to begin with the Service of Light.

A new fire is kindled.

Dear friends in Christ, on this most holy night our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life. The Lord invites his people throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord! We remember his death and resurrection by hearing his Word and by Celebrating his sacraments. In them Christ gives us confidence and hope that we shall share his victory over death and live with him forever.

+ THE SERVICE OF LIGHT +

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

After a period of reflection, a small candle is lighted.

Let us pray. Father, we share in the light of your glory through your Son, the light of the world. Bless this flame and those who keep this Easter festival of light which has no ending; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

As the following words are said, the presiding minister traces a cross, an Alpha and an Omega, and the date of the current year on the Paschal Candle to indicate that the Risen Christ is the Lord of the universe for all time.

Christ, yesterday and today, the beginning and the end; Alpha! and Omega! All time belongs to him, and all the ages, to him be glory and power, through every age and forever.

The Paschal Candle is lighted from the new light.

May the light of Christ, rising in glory this night dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds. The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Let us pray. Almighty God, pour out your abundant blessing on this lighted candle, so that all who share this night in your mysteries may be filled with your grace and heavenly blessing, that as we were in darkness but are now in the light of the Lord, we may walk as children of the light; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The following is sung three times as the procession leads the people into the church nave.



Rejoice, now, all heavenly choirs of angels, and celebrate the divine mysteries with exultation; and, for the victory of so great a King, sound the trumpet of salvation. Exult, also, O earth, enlightened with such radiance; and, made brilliant by the splendor of the eternal King know that the ancient darkness has been banished from all the world. Be glad also, O mother Church, clothed with the brightness of such a light, and let this house resound with the triumphant voices of the peoples.




It is indeed right and salutary that we should with full devotion of heart and mind and voice praise the invisible God, the Father Almighty, and his only Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ; who paid for us the debt of Adam to the eternal Father, and who by his precious blood redeemed us from the bondage to the ancient sin. For this indeed is the Paschal Feast in which the true Lamb is slain, by whose blood the door posts of the faithful are made holy. This is the night in which, in ancient times, you delivered our forebears, the children of Israel, from the land of Egypt; and led them, dryshod, through the Red Sea. This is the night in which all who believe in Christ are rescued from evil and the gloom of sin, are renewed in grace, and are restored to holiness, by the rising brightness. This is the night in which, breaking the chains of death, Christ arises from hell in triumph. O Night truly blessed which alone was worthy to know the time and the hour wherein Christ arose again from hell! O night truly blessed in which heaven and earth are joined - things human and things divine. We, therefore, pray to you, O Lord, that he, in whose honor this candle burns, will continue to vanquish the darkness of this night and faithfully shed light on all the human race; through the same Lord, Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and rules with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit one God, now and forever. Amen.

+ THE SERVICE OF READING +

Dear Friends in Christ, we have begun our solemn vigil. Let us now listen attentively to the Word of God, recalling how he saved his people throughout history and, in the fullness of time, sent his Son to be our redeemer.

The antiphon "Send Fourth Your Spirit" follows each reading. It is sung by the cantor and then repeated by the congregation.

+THE AFFIRMATION OF HOLY BAPTISM +

The people stand turning toward the Baptismal font.

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Antiphon

 Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We give you thanks, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and you created heaven and earth. By the gift of water you nourish and sustain us and all living things.

By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and saved those whom you had chosen, Noah and his family. You led Israel by the pillar of cloud and fire through the sea, out of slavery into the freedom of the promised land. In the waters of the Jordan your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. By the baptism of his own death and resurrection your beloved Son has set us free from the bondage to sin and death, and has opened the way to the joy and freedom of everlasting life. He made water a sign of the kingdom and of cleansing and rebirth. In obedience to his command, we make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

To you be given praise and honor and worship through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Sprit, now and forever.

Amen.

Sisters and brothers, on this most holy night the church keeps vigil, awaiting the glorious resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Apostle teaches us that by our Baptism we are buried with Christ and lay dead in order that as Christ was raised from the dead in the splendor of the Father, so we should set our feet on the new path of life. Therefore, now that the struggle of Lent is over, let us renew the promises made at Baptism.

I therefore, ask you: Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil and all his empty promises?

I do.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into hell.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God, the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

You have made public confession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to

hear his Word and share in his supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

Let us pray. Gracious Lord, through water and the Holy Spirit you have made these men and women your own. You forgave them all their sins and brought them to newness of life. Continue to strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, and daily increase in them your gifts of grace the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord.



Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.
