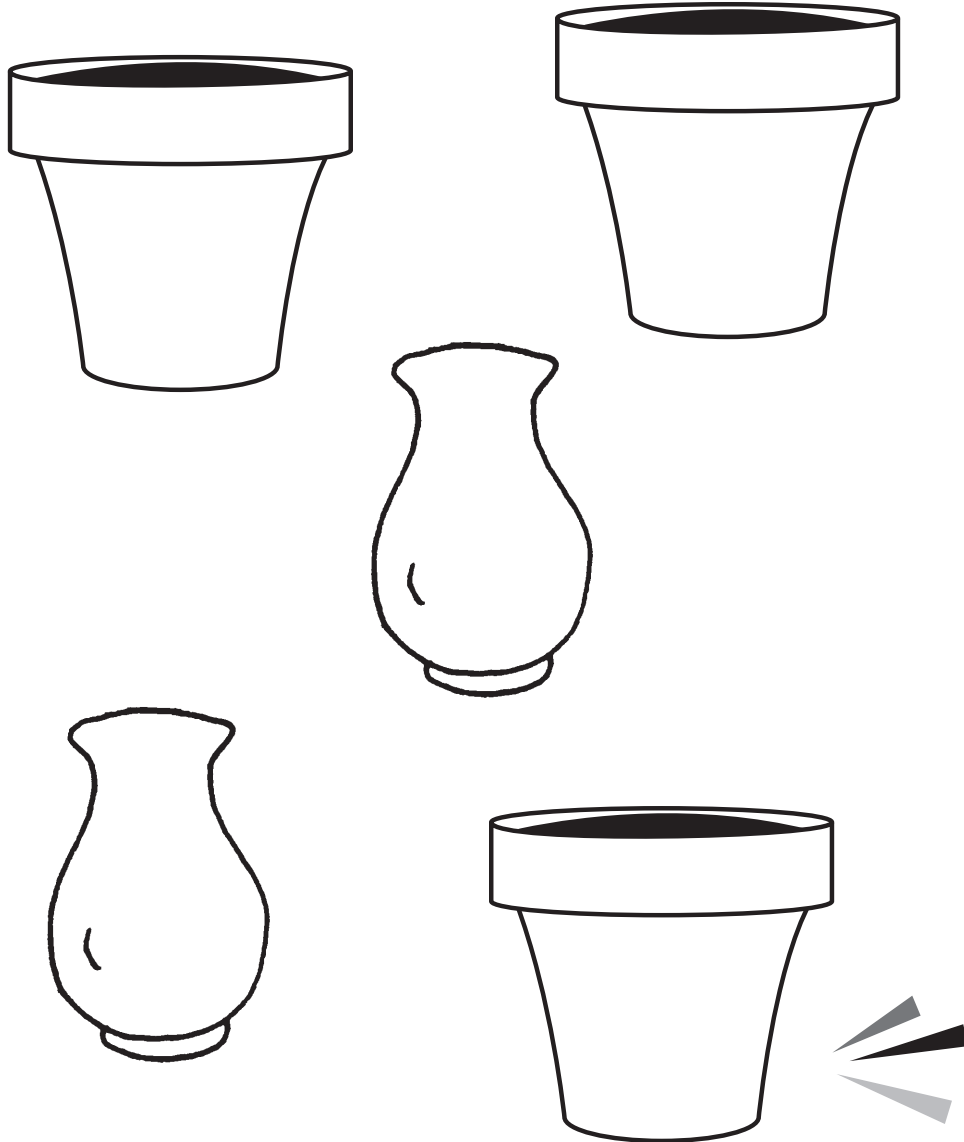


Easter Florals

What kinds of flowers do you see growing outside? Draw these flowers in the flower pots below.



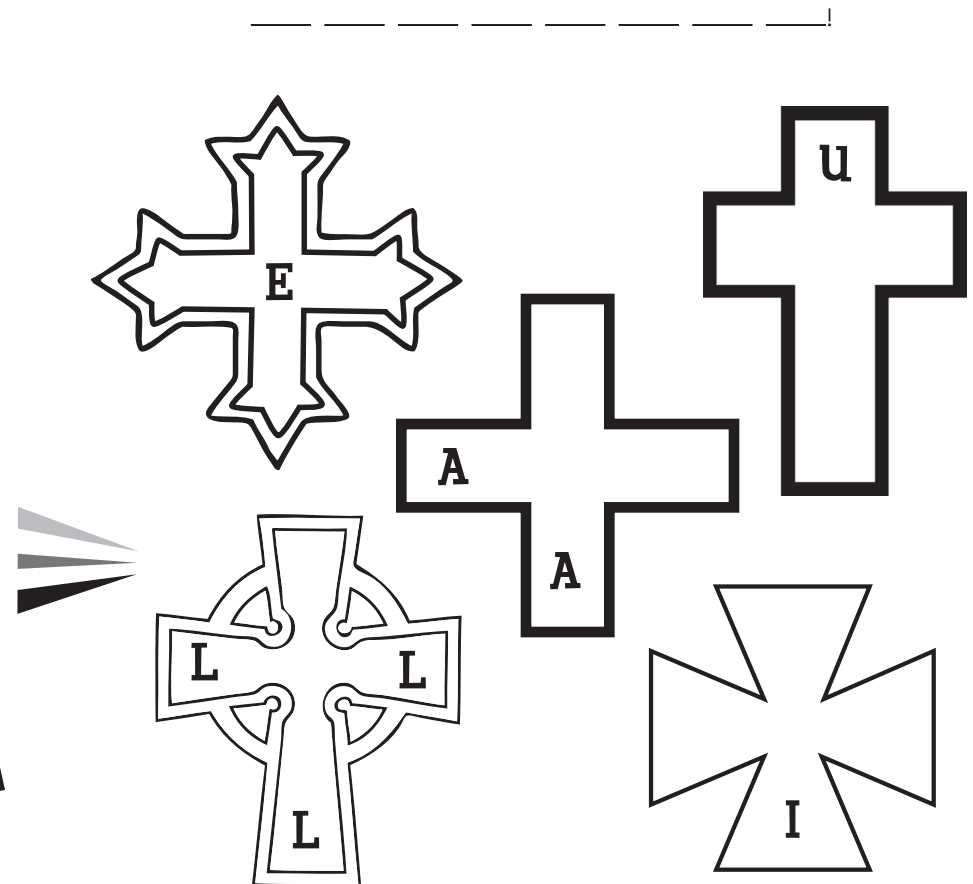

- Alleluia means **Praise God!**

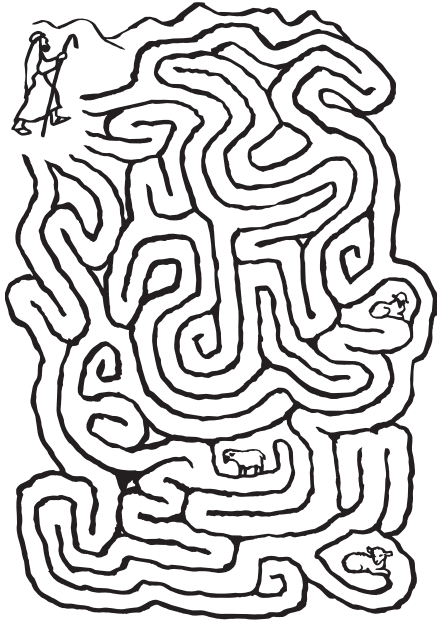
Coded Crosses

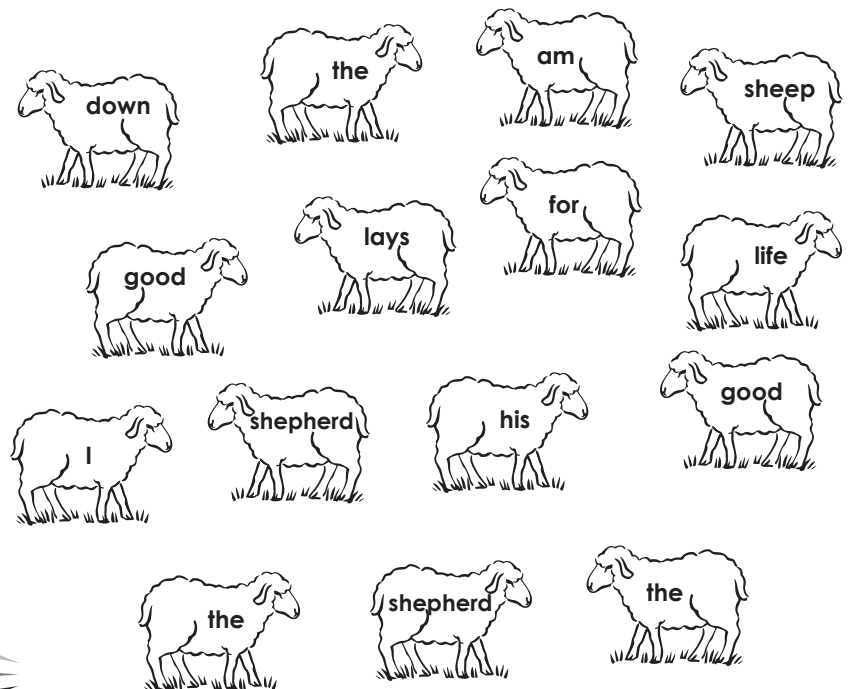
