The changing seasons are reflected in our Sunday worship. While each week is a celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection, seasonal changes help us to focus on different aspects of the liturgy. During the month of October we will resume the "continual reading" often referred to as the Second Reading. We will begin to read from Hebrews. Each week we read a bit more of it until we have read through its 13 chapters. This particular book of the New Testament provides us with insights from those who first heard the gospel through contemporaries of Jesus, and how their conversion to Christian faith brought on physical persecution. We will also begin to sing a four part setting of the Sanctus. You are encouraged to sing your voice part (soprano, alto, tenor or bass) for



this beautiful musical setting by Franz Schubert. We haven't been singing very much through the past year and a half and our musical skills are surely beginning to atrophy. The hope of the Worship and Arts Committee is to have us singing in four parts in preparation for Reformation Sunday, October 31.

Additionally we will observe St. Luke Day with a service of healing on October 17. The handbell choir is scheduled to ring a peaceful anthem while worshipers come forward to receive anointing with oil and prayer for healing. We are blessed to have several retired clergy to assist Pastor Reep so that the healing component of the liturgy moves along smoothly. Later in the month we will recognize two of our former preschool teachers who retired at the end of the 2020/21 school year; Sue Deppen (2 year old teacher) and Kathy Monk (4 year old teacher and Assistant Preschool Director). On that day we extend an enthusiastic welcome to our preschool children and families and are planning to have our own St. Paul's children lift their voices in song. Recognizing the importance for ongoing reformation in the church and in our lives we will observe Reformation Sunday, October 31. In 1517 there were some 95 things that needed to be discussed for the faith community as they elected to live more fully into their baptismal calling. The list of things for us to discuss may not be any shorter today. We will include hymns from the reformation period as a way to show our solidarity and continuity with our forbearers in faith. We had hoped that we could restore the chalice to the gathered assembly at our Reformation observance, however with the surging cases of Covid-19 holding steady in our community that seems unlikely. We will continue plans to do so in the near future. To facilitate this important aspect of our Sunday liturgy we will need additional servers each week. Communion Assistants with steady hands to pour the wine into individual glasses. Altar guild members are needed to wash and sanitize the glasses following each service. Ushers are needed to direct and lead people to the chancel step. Currently we are stretched thin and are indeed shorthanded in most areas of serving so if you are willing to take an active part or resume duties that you once performed please do notify the church office and provide that valuable information.

Be sure to come offering your prayer, praise and thanksgiving to God. And if you cannot join us in person then please do join us through the church live stream available through our YouTube channel (St. Paul's Lutheran Church S. George Street, York PA). A link to the channel is included each week when the service bulletin is emailed to you and through the webpage at stpaulsyork.org.

God's Work our Hands

This year for the annual ELCA God's Work our Hands on September 12 the children and youth of St. Paul's enjoyed a variety of water activities out front on the Springettsbury Lawn. The focus this year was on the need for water, especially drinkable water, to sustain communities in places that are suffering from draught and lack infrastructure. The offerings they collected from St Paul's congregation and a



donation from Benevolence will go to Lutheran World Relief and their efforts to supply water, wells, and irrigation so that people can flourish. The children and youth learned about how much water is truly needed to survive for both families and animals. 16 children and youth along with 17 adults participated in this activity.

CREATE

What an amazing turnout for the first few weeks of CREATE. It is so nice to have the children and youth back in the building. In September the children ages 2 through kindergarten heard the stories about Creation, Adam and Eve and Noah. Along with the story they colored pictures and did a hands-on craft about the story. The children and youth grade 1 through 6 learned the first 3 commandments. They participated in a



discussion about how we use the commandments in everyday life and had fun playing minute to win it games and working on a banner about the commandments.

During the month of October children ages 2 through kindergarten will be learning about Joseph, Baby Moses, Moses and Pharaoh, and doing a fun Halloween craft. The children and youth grades 1 through 6 will be learning commandments 4, 5, 6 and 7, along with fun activities.
