Our worship during the season of Epiphany will be shaped by the liturgical musical setting and hymns. We will be relying on *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* setting 6 with its distinctive jazz motifs and hymns drawing from the imagery of the assigned biblical texts. One new song that will be given prominence each week is *Glory to God, Whose Goodness Shines*, text and music by Paul M. Vasile. Paul is a church musician, consultant, composer, and teacher. He finds that his greatest joy comes in collaborative and community-centered ministry. As we utilize his setting of the Gloria patria let us discover great joy in our community-centered ministry at St. Paul's Church. And please do join in singing the spirited melodic line.



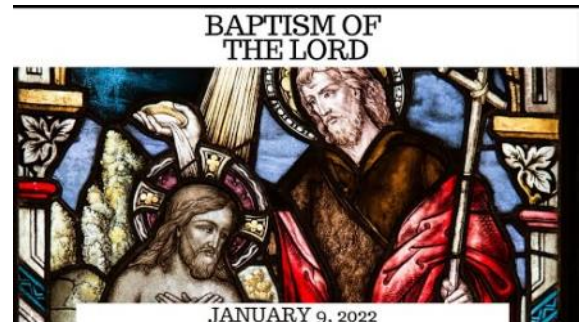
The Baptism of Our Lord Sunday January 9

Reading from the Biblical narrative, Jesus comes to the Jordan River to be baptized by John. In Advent we heard about John, his preaching, his baptizing, and his call for repentance. He also announced that one mightier than he was coming. On the festival of the Baptism of Our Lord we celebrate the Mighty One, Jesus, who comes and is baptized marking the official beginning of his public ministry.

We are blessed this year with people coming to St. Paul's uniting with our community of faith. Some will receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism while others will affirm their faith and baptism and will begin to share in the public ministry that has been entrusted to us. At the 8:00 AM liturgy we will all share in a Thanksgiving for Baptism. At the 10:30 AM liturgy we will celebrate the sacrament of Holy Baptism for some and receive others into St. Paul's Lutheran Church membership.

This feast day brings a close to the season of Christmas and moves us into a season of making Christ known. We make Christ known by what we say and do; by the way we live our lives, by the choices and decisions that we make daily. During this bright season of Epiphany let the light of Christ shine through you brightening the way for others.

If you or someone you know would like to receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism please contact the church office or Pastor Reep as soon as possible. The adult education lesson for January 9 will be led by Pastor Reep using the Small Catechism section on Holy Baptism. The class will be held in Christ Hall starting at 9:15 AM. This is an opportunity to learn and grow in faith and life. Be sure to come.

Sunday School for Children

Classes begin again on Sunday, January 9. All children will gather in the nave at 9:15 am for a large group opening including songs and introduction to the story. Children will then be dismissed to their classrooms.

Children will be using lectionary-based curriculum which means they will be studying one of the lessons that are read in church each week. Families can take the opportunity to revisit the stories later in the day, looking at the learner leaflet, discussing what they remember and what they will take with them throughout the coming week.

Covid Mitigation for Children's Sunday School—Recognizing that children 5 and under are not eligible to receive the Covid-19 vaccine, the Christian Education Committee, with input from the Covid Task Force, is planning the following procedures: All classrooms will be cleaned before and after our use on Sunday mornings. Students will have their own pencil boxes with supplies. We will not be serving snacks. Children two and older and adults are asked to wear masks. If someone in your household is ill or exposed to a suspected case of Covid, please stay home and enjoy the online resources. We will be monitoring and updating procedures regularly.

Spark family magazine provides ways for you to talk about God and Jesus with your children. St. Paul's subscribes to this magazine for our families with young children sending it directly to your home. . Take time to read the stories with your children and try out some of the activities. Enjoy growing in faith together. (If you are not receiving this magazine, simply call the church office and asked to be added to the subscription list.)

At Home Epiphany Celebrations: January 6th is the day we call Epiphany, the coming of the wisemen to see the baby Jesus. It is the 12th and final day of Christmas and for some it is the day of exchanging gifts in remembrance of the wisemen bringing gifts to Jesus. Take time to read the story from the Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12. Another tradition is the eating of the Kings Cake, believed to originated in France around the 12th century. Bake any cake or coffee cake recipe. Hide a dried bean or coin in the cake. Some use a small plastic baby Jesus. The person who gets the piece with the hidden surprise becomes the king for the day. Use the following table prayer at dinner. And plan to join us for Vespers at Church at 7:00 PM.



Epiphany Table Prayer: O God, by the leading of a star you made yourself known to the peoples of the earth. Lead us to your presence, where we may see your glory face to face. Bless this food to our bodies that it may nourish and sustain us. Amen.

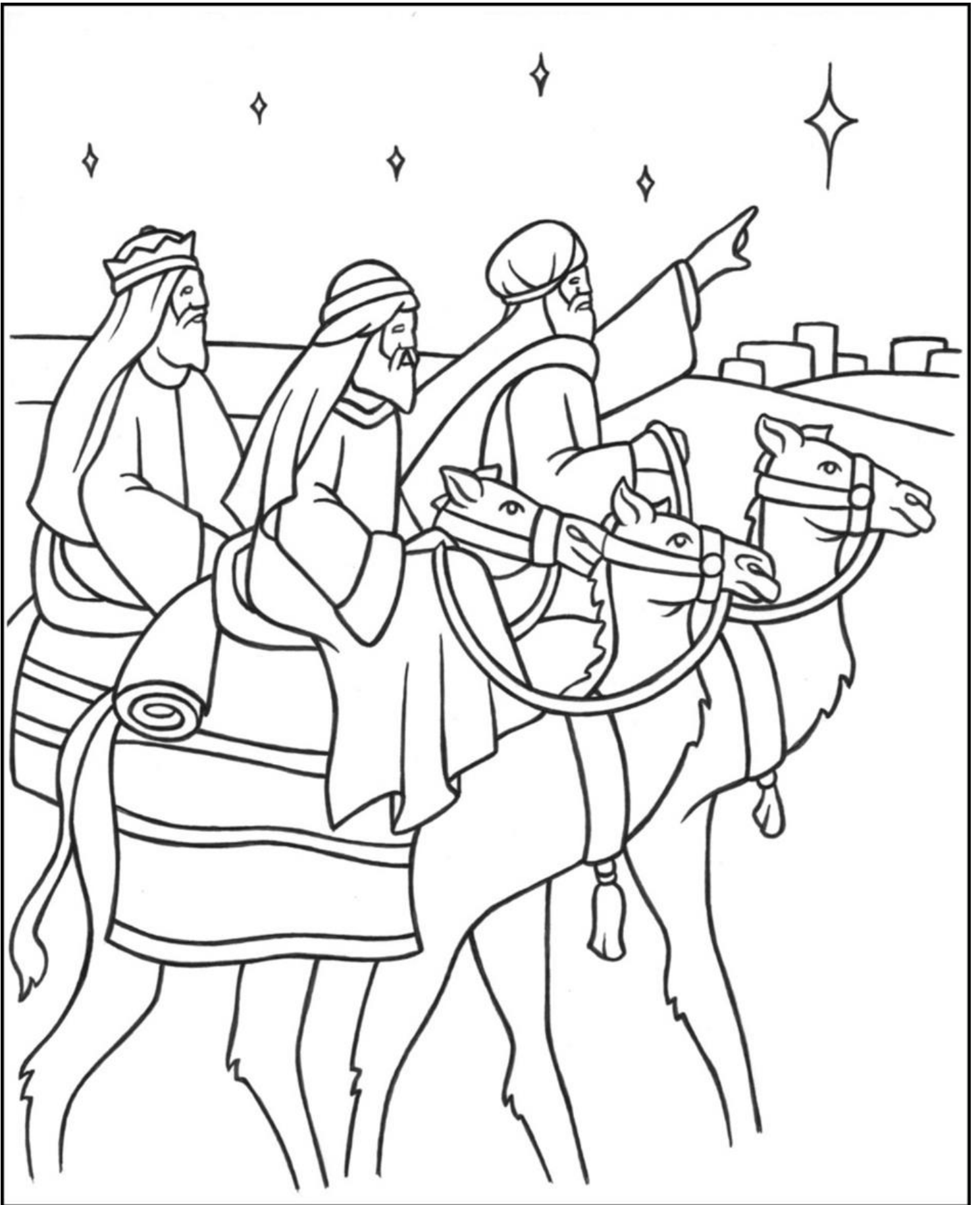
The Small Catechism—Led by Pastor Reep

Please take calendars with you to use as an evangelism tool to assist you in talking about the Lord, Christ Jesus, and the ministry that is carried out in his name through our congregation. As Lutherans it seems that we have trouble when it comes to talking about faith and life. The good news is that you don't have to use religious sounding language. You simply need to use everyday words and tell the story. The story we are telling is about feeding the hungry. We do it week in and week out. We took on debt to do it. We are, as Jesus was and is, committed to feeding the hungry. Would you like to be part of that?

A donation, some of your money, some of your time, has been given over to and for the work of ministry when you or someone you are talking with receives a calendar and makes a donation. Honestly, it doesn't really matter the dollar amount. The calendar provides a person with a concrete tangible item that will remind them implicitly every day for a year about the importance of feeding the hungry. The story can be lengthened by telling about the art work, about the harvest dinner and auction, about the generosity of people giving. And then you can bring it to a close reminding yourself or another of the generosity of God's love of you and for you. Please take calendars and tell the story of the food pantry and of God's love.

Congregation Council Highlights

The Council met for their regular meeting on December 13 in the Good Shepherd Room at 7:00 PM. The meeting was called to order. Dan Garber opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes from the November meeting were approved.

The agenda was adopted.

Newly elected council members were welcomed to the meeting. They are Alexis Heistand, Chris Lipp, Steve Schedin and Carol Woodbury.

President Tristan Ericson commented on the faithfulness of the congregation and the strength of financial giving throughout the year.

Treasurer Peter O’Conor presented the financial report. He too commented on the strength of envelope giving and our ability to meet all financial obligations.

A request from the preschool to hold a spring sandwich sale was approved.

Council approved staff Christmas bonuses. The dollar amounts were increased to reflect cost of living increases.

A request from the Mpuguso Committee to wire transfer funds collect by St. Paul’s for their new church building was approved. The dollar amount will be exactly what has been received to date.

A recommendation from the Mutual Ministry and Preschool Committee to add Laura Tate to the preschool substitute teacher list was approved.

Reflections on the November Annual Meeting were positive in nature and reflected what the council had hoped to accomplish.

A revised Health and Safety plan for the preschool was approved. Up-dates were made in conjunction with the Covid Task Force and preschool staff members.

The council revisited the practice of wearing masks during public worship. The council supports continuing the current practice but will revisit it again in the New Year. The Covid Task Force will be consulted and the Worship and Arts Committee will explore some additional avenues.

Council election of officers yielded: Tristan Ericson, President; Nancy Bennett, Vice-president; Kathleen Lemke, Secretary; Peter O’Conor, Treasurer. They were thanked for their willingness to serve. The council members and officers will be installed at the 10:30 AM liturgy on January 2, 2022.

Council members completing their term of service were thanked. They are Mike Hanson, Patty Snyder and Kem Vaught.

The meeting concluded at 8:50 PM. Tristan offered a closing prayer.
