Ash Wednesday

March 2, Noon & 7:00 PM

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. It has historically been a day of great solemnity in the church. It is a day for us to recommit ourselves to the disciplines of Christian life. Fasting, prayer, devotion, and worship all help to focus our attention on Jesus, God's Son, who loves us so much that he comes among us, lives with us, dies for us and is raised up so that we have life now and for eternity.



Services on Ash Wednesday will be held at Noon and at 7:00 PM. Both services will include a Lenten Confession, imposition of ashes and Holy Communion. May our Lenten season move us from ashes to Easter's shouts of alleluia!

Communion in both kinds

On Ash Wednesday we will resume distribution of Holy Communion, the body and blood of Christ, with both bread and wine. Our COVID Task Force reviewed the plan submitted by the Worship and Arts Committee and approved it at their February 15 meeting. We will begin the Lenten season with the fullness of our Eucharistic celebration restored. After two years of receiving only the communion host it will seem a bit strange to return to the pouring chalice. Actually it has been since the late summer of 2017 when we last used individual cups and pouring chalice for the weekly distribution of the sacrament.



Those were the days before we began the renovation and construction period. Once construction began we did not have access to the work sacristy. At that time we kept the common chalice and provided for an intinction chalice. This option required very little work space to wash and dry four chalices.

The restoration of communion in both kinds requires a great deal of planning and additional volunteer staff. We extend our sincere appreciation to the COVID Task Force for their commitment to keeping us on a trajectory of health and safety. We thank the Altar Guild members who will take on the additional responsibility of preparing for the Sunday liturgy as well as the washing, rinsing and sanitizing of the communion glasses. And we thank those who will serve as communion assistants during the Sunday liturgy. If you would like to help with one or more aspects of this newly added part of our weekly gathering, please notify Pastor Reep. The wine will be made available by pouring chalice and individual communion glasses. The procedure listed below will be provided in the Sunday bulletin to assist worshippers.

- 1. Come to communion using the center aisle (about 8 adults per side).
- 2. Communion glasses are placed on credence tables at the front pews (left and right side).
- 3. Take a communion glass from the tray of glasses.
- 4. Take your place along the chancel step.
- 5. Remove your face mask.
- 6. Extend your hands to receive the communion host.
- 7. Consume the communion host.
- 8. Hold the communion glass with both hands at chest height so that the communion assistant can easily pour the wine into the glass.
- 9. Consume the wine.
- 10. Replace your face mask.
- 11. Place the used cup in an empty tray located on a credence table at the side aisle.
- 12. Return to your pew using the side aisle.

If you are so moved to join us in singing for this Lenten Season and Easter Day kindly notify the church office of your intentions so that we can have; childcare if necessary, folders, books and all music ready for you when we resume rehearsals on March 3 @ 7:30 PM. At this time we still plan on wearing masks. We hope to hear your voice in the Chancel Choir as we observe the 40 days of Lent and the joys of Easter announcing resurrection hope.

In late August and early September 2021 Hurricane Ida rolled into Pennsylvania leaving widespread flooding and destruction in her path. Along with others, volunteers from the Lower


Susquehanna Synod Lutheran Disaster Response Network began reaching out to homeowners needing assistance and helped to muck out basements and make assessments about repair work that would be needed. York County is one of eight counties under a federal disaster declaration in PA following Ida. Funds are needed to assist homeowners with replacing hot water heaters and furnaces, purchasing building materials and supplies to restore homes and simply to carry out the work of long-term recovery right here in York County. St. Paul's Lutheran Church will be donating our Lenten offering this year to this very important work. Wednesday offerings during Lent as well as offerings specially marked using the offering envelope found in the pew, will be used for this appeal.

On Sunday, March 13th, Pastor William Snyder and Pastor Glenn Beard, Coordinator of the Lower Susquehanna Synod LDR Network, will lead a conversation about the work of Lutheran Disaster Response, throughout the world and here at home, and will address this local effort as well. Join us in Christ Hall at 9:15 AM

The Parables of Jesus recorded in the Gospel of Luke.

Jesus, according to the biblical witness, is a story teller. The biblical name for the stories that he tells are parables. The Gospel of Luke contains a majority of them and has a few that are unique. During our 2022 Lenten journey we will be hearing many of these stories. The Barren Fig Tree and the Prodigal Son are two parables that will be heard during the Sunday morning liturgy. Five additional ones will be heard during Wednesday evening vespers; The Rich Fool, The Great Dinner, The Lost Sheep, The Dishonest Manager, and The Ten Pounds (Talents). You can see from the list that the parables will be the catalyst for Lenten preaching. We have invited Pastor Beth Schlegel and the congregations where she serves, St. Peter's North York and Christ Church Manchester to join us in our mid-week Lenten services. We shall listen a new to the parables of Jesus allowing his stories of faith and life to shape our own faith and life as we move from Ashes on Ash Wednesday (March 2) to the Alleluias of Easter (April 17). Plan now to join in person at St. Paul's church or through the live stream on the Wednesdays of Lent at 7:00 PM. Please do share the link with friends, neighbors and coworkers. And may we all be renewed through hearing Jesus' parables calling us to a deeper relationship with him and with our neighbors.



SUNDAY MORNINGS 9:15-10:15 AM

March 6 – St. Paul's Food Pantry- Larry and Janet Moore will tell about our Food Pantry serving York County for 40 years, how it runs, who keeps it running and who it serves. A tour of the Food Pantry will be included.

March 13 – Lutheran Disaster Response – Reverend Glenn Beard, the point person for our local Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and Reverend William Snyder will discuss what Lutheran Disaster Response does, locally nationally, and globally. A Response Project for victims of Hurricane Ida, which hit York County in 2021, will be highlighted. Offerings will be received during the Lenten Season for LDR.

March 20 – St. Paul's Preschool – Deb Becker, director, and Allison Lehr, assistant director, will talk about the history of our preschool and its current ministry. Learn how this ministry not only aids in the emotional, physical, and academic development of young children but also supports the spiritual growth of these children and their families. A tour of some of the newly renovated classrooms will be included.

March 27 – Mpuguso Lutheran Church in Tanzania and other ministries to Tanzania – Pastor Judy McKee and Pastor Stanley Reep will tell of St. Paul's history with this congregation in Tanzania, including visits from both churches to each other's homes, and the many ways we have worked together to further God's Kingdom through scholarship aide and assistance with construction projects.

April 3 – Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania LAMPa – Tracey DePasquale, director, will present informative news about the ways Lutherans can keep informed, and participate in, state and national government discussions and legislation as guided by LAMPa's mission statement: *In response to God's love in Jesus Christ, we advocate for wise and just public policies in Pennsylvania that promote the common good.*

Devotional Writing Mission Project

One of the most important relationships we have as a congregation is our relationship with the Mpuguso congregation in the Konde Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania. We have supported this congregation in many ways over the past two decades, and we have learned much from them, helping us to grow into a fuller understanding of the Christian faith and the fellowship that we share with others around the world.



We have hosted visitors and students from our companion congregation, and some of our members have had

the opportunity to travel to the Konde Diocese and visit with our brothers and sisters in Mpuguso. A dozen years ago we helped them with the construction of a hostel so that young women would have a safe place to reside while taking classes to complete their education. We helped with the organization of a preschool/kindergarten and a kitchen so that students received a well prepared meal while at school. Most recently we have contributed to the construction of their new church building while providing tuition scholarships for some children of the pastors of the Konde Diocese to continue their education and attempting to help meet the medical needs of the area through scholarship aid for those entering medical professions.

Our Mpuguso Committee continues to seek new ways that our fellowship and our mutual faith can grow and mature. The Committee is asking you to participate in a new endeavor. They are asking you to contribute to a devotional booklet that will contain short devotions composed by and shared among the members of St. Paul's congregation and the Mpuguso congregation. What we are asking you to do is to think about your favorite Scripture verse or story. If you can't pick a favorite, we are asking that you pick a Scripture verse or story that has been important to you. Then we are asking you to quote that verse or identify that story and, in one-page or less, tell us why this verse has been meaningful to you. What would you like to share with others about this verse and what it has meant to you? Then, as an attachment, please email your devotional page to tandjmckeel@comast.net.

If you have any questions about this, please call or e-mail the church office. Our brother Elisha at Mpuguso is collecting devotional stories too and will be translating the devotions from members of Mpuguso Lutheran Church into English as well as St. Paul's devotions into Swahili. We hope then to merge St. Paul's devotions and Mpuguso devotions into one devotional booklet for all to use during the Pentecost season. So that we can accomplish this, we ask that you submit devotional writings by April 8. Thank you for your consideration as well as your willingness to joyfully share in faith with our sisters and brothers here in York and in our sister congregation in Tanzania.

Nina and Phillip Friedman Scholarship

Active members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church who will be attending York College of Pennsylvania for the fall 2022 academic year should make their request know to Pastor Reep. Please indicate your intentions by April 1, 2022 so that you can be recommended for the Friedman Scholarship administered by York College of Pennsylvania. Pastor Reep will notify the Office of Financial Aid with the names of St. Paul's members seeking financial aid from this scholarship.

The Nina and Phillip Friedman Memorial Scholarship, designed for students attending York College of Pennsylvania, was established in 1984. The scholarship was funded through the generosity of the Friedman's estate. Their relationship with St. Paul's Lutheran Church and Temple Beth Israel gave access to the scholarship for members and children from the two congregations. Additionally recommendations by the President of the College may also be included. The scholarship is not need based. Numerous members of St. Paul's have benefitted from the Freidman Scholarship and bridge a wide area of study. Please make your intentions known by April 1, 2022.


2022 Flower Chart

Congregational Council Retreat

The Congregational Council met on January 22, 2022, at 9:00 am in the Good Shepherd Room. Pastor Reep gave the opening prayer and devotion. Tristan Ericson presented St. Paul's mission, to teach the word that God is



love, and the council's goals for the morning. Each member shared what drew us to St. Paul's Church, what keeps us here as members, something important to us about St. Paul's and/or the Lutheran faith, and our faith history. Members were asked to familiarize themselves with the investment portfolio on Google docs and discussion continued on staff raises. Members broke out into three groups to brainstorm the easy, moderate, and difficult things that would positively impact St. Paul's within the next year, and the next 5+ years.
