Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion—8:00 AM, 8:45 AM, 9:15 AM, and 10:30 AM

We begin Holy Week by observing Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion on April 10. The entire morning is given over to this important day in the life of Christian faith. The worship schedule has been altered to facilitate the many aspects of the day. You may participate in the entire morning or select those portions that will be most meaningful for you and for your family.

We begin with Matins (Morning Prayer) at 8:00 AM. The liturgy welcomes the morning and sets before us a reading from the Old Testament from the prophet Isaiah and a reading from the New Testament from Philippians. The Chancel Choir will render the morning Psalms and an anthem. There will be a sermon based on the texts. And the prayers for the community and world will bring the service to a close. There will not be a celebration of Holy Communion at this liturgy.

Following Morning Prayer the Fellowship Committee will provide a simple breakfast outside. Breakfast is provided for those who have gathered for Morning Prayer as well as for those who are coming too participated in the Palm Sunday Procession. The time of fellowship is offered as a way for us to begin to get to know one another. Please do share in conversation and do introduce yourself. Please don't make assumptions about people knowing who you are.

At 9:15 AM we will gather at the Garden of Memory for the Processional Gospel Reading, the blessing of the Palms, and a short homily about the day and our participation. Children in the Create Tuesday program should bring the shakers that they made to make musical accompaniment as we process through the neighborhood waving our palm branches and shouting "hosanna!" Please wear appropriate shoes for walking! When we arrive back at the church there will be a short Sunday school lesson provided for children. Adults will gather in Christ Hall for coffee and conversation.

The 10:30 AM liturgy will begin with a joyful Palm Sunday handbell anthem provided by our Adult Handbell Choir. The liturgy will quickly change tone to a more somber character as we hear the Prayer of the Day and move immediately to the reading of the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke. Holy Communion will be celebrated. Palm branches will be available for worshipers to take home.

Please plan to participate in some aspect of Palm/Passion Sunday. Give consideration to taking in the entire morning. Perhaps this approach to the day may open up something new to you. And do invite a friend or family member to come with you. With such a rich beginning to our Holy Week observance we are bound to be drawn closer to Christ our Lord and Savior and to our sisters and brothers in our community of faith.

The Vigil of Easter, Holy Saturday 7:00 p.m.

On Holy Saturday we shall gather to celebrate what is, unquestionably, the most important liturgy in the church year – The Great Vigil of Easter. Around this liturgy the entire church year was built. Unfortunately it has been greatly neglected by the church. These days more and more congregations are celebrating it and recognizing the powerful message that it holds. It is a liturgy you will not want to miss. What follows is a fairly detailed description and explanation of it.

The Easter Vigil is the church's yearly celebration of the Paschal (Passover) Feast. It celebrates our Lord's "Passover" from death to new life, his passage and exodus to the Father. In this most solemn liturgy, the faithful followers of Christ go from death to new life with him.

This theme of death to life is appropriately expressed in the entire content of the Easter Vigil. As the message of the Vigil is proclaimed, there can be no mistaking the true meaning of the resurrection. We are impressed with the fact that Christianity is a passage religion, that in fulfillment of Israel's exodus out of Egypt, Jesus leads the new Israel, his Church, through yet another "Passover." He leads us out of bondage to sin and death into a new and promising life of holiness and joy. There are four parts to the Easter Vigil. The first centers around fire or light as a symbol of Christ who said "I am the light of the world," and who, "from three days sleep in death, as a sun has risen." The liturgy begins in darkness, the darkness of sin, the darkness of the tomb, and the darkness of death that covers an unredeemed world. In the midst of this darkness, a new fire is struck. The Old Testament tells us that God chose fire as a sign of his presence in the burning bush on Sinai, in the pillar of fire in the wilderness, and in the fire of sacrifice on the temple altar. The kindling of this new fire is a vivid reminder of the presence of Christ with his people.

Following the striking of the new flame, the Paschal Candle is lighted. This large white candle, symbolic of Jesus, the new "Pillar of fire," is carried into the darkened church by a deacon as if carried into the tomb. Light from the Paschal Candle is gradually spread to candles held by everyone in the church. The deacon then sings the great Easter announcement called "The Exsultet," which proclaims the good news of the Resurrection.



Altar Care—We have resumed our historic patterns in worship. With this return we are in need of persons willing to prepare and clean up the altar each week. Historically this ministry team served a month at a time. Please contact Pastor Reep for additional information.

Lenten Offering Opportunity

In late August and early September Hurricane Ida rolled into Pennsylvania leaving widespread flooding and destruction in her path. Along with others, volunteers from the Lower Susquehanna Synod Lutheran Disaster Response Network began reaching out to homeowners needing assistance and helped to muck out basements and make assessments about repair work that would be needed. Funds are needed to assist homeowners with replacing hot water heaters and furnaces, purchasing building materials and supplies to restore homes and simply to carry out the work of long-term recovery right here in York County. Wednesday Bible Study

Wednesday Bible Study is held at 10:30 AM in Christ Hall. During the season of Easter the first reading each Sunday is from the book of Acts. We will spent a portion of our time together gaining greater insight into the book of Acts while still spending time reflecting on the Easter gospel readings. The Acts of the Apostles is a continuation of the narrative of the Gospel according to Luke. The book of Acts can be divided into two large portions. The first portion centers on Peter and deals with the early church in Jerusalem in the days following the resurrection of Jesus. The second portion centers on Paul and deals with his three missionary journeys and the expansion of the message of Christ crucified, raised and ascended. These readings direct our Sunday worship during this joyous season of Easter with a dual focus on the good news that God has raised Jesus from death to life and in our missionary effort to tell and share the good news with others here and around the world. Please bring your Bible and join us!

Students will complete their session of confirmation when they submit their packet of worship notes to Miss Kelly or Pastor Reep. The next scheduled time to meet is slated for September when we begin a new unit and welcome new students.

Congregation Council Highlights

Church Council met on March 7th in the Good Shepherd Room. President Tristan Ericson expressed that many activities and Committee Reports reflects the health and growth of church life.



Financial: Treasurer Peter O'Connor announced that even with the Stock Market challenges the church's investment fund value is 3.6 million dollars and the current pattern of giving should carry the church through the year. Peter advised that we remain careful and strategic regarding the church's investment portfolio now managed by Fulton Bank.

Council approved that Refugee Aide Donations for Ukraine will begin immediately and be handled by the ECLA Disaster Relief because 100% of the donations will go to aide and no administrative fee will be charged.

Harvest Dinner: Ann Anstadt reported that the Harvest Dinner and Auction will now be called Harvest Dinner and will take place October 8th. The chef who provided food for the past dinners is unavailable and a new chef will be sought. Ticket sales will begin on Mother's Day and proceeds will benefit the Food Pantry.

Summer Service: Worship and Art recommended that summer worship be a combined liturgy at 9:15 AM and with evening Vespers once a month. The intention is to have a 9:15 AM combined summer service from June to August. The expectation is that the summer schedule will provide more fellowship amongst the congregation.

Preschool: The preschool will purchase a formal curriculum, *Play to Learn*, which will be implemented in the fall of 2022. Preschool staff will receive specialized training to support students with behavioral concerns.

Attendance: Sunday attendance at the 8:00 AM service is consistent and we are experiencing growth for the 10:30 AM and live-stream services. It was suggested that council explore the possibility of providing technology training for members wishing help to access the virtual service option.

Masks: With York County trending toward the CDC benchmark and our Task Force recommended metric goal of 5%, council approved to make mask wearing optional for both services with the elimination of the Red Zone Pews. Communion servers will continue to wear masks at distribution of communion. Council also recommended that Preschool leadership communicate with the Covid Task Force for determine the best next steps regarding masking.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Reep shared that there will be two baptisms at the Easter Sunday 10:30 AM Service, there will be five students confirming their faith on May 1st, and a goal is to reactivate the Women's Group over the summer of 2022 so that it can resume in the fall.
