and that mutual love should continue.



Confirmation Ministry—Begins September 11

The 2022/23 Confirmation ministry program will be held on Sunday morning concurrent with Sunday school. The majority of participants this year have younger siblings who regularly attend Sunday school classes. With this knowledge it was logical to switch instruction from Sunday evenings to Sunday mornings. This should work well for all of our families. The fall term will focus on prayer, specifically the Lord's Prayer. Sessions will begin on September 11 with an intergenerational kick off for God's Work our Hands. Units on the Lord's Prayer will follow for 9 weeks. Thanksgiving to Christmas will be devoted to a Nativity play scheduled for presentation on December 18 or joining with the adults on themes of the Advent Season.

Wednesday Scripture Study—Resumes September 7

Following the Labor Day Weekend our mid-week Bible study will begin on September 7 at 10:30 AM. With renewed enthusiasm we will delve into the readings for the upcoming Sunday. We begin with Exodus and the story of the image of a calf, Luke and the parable of the lost sheep, words from Amos about trampling on the poor, and words from Jesus about being faithful in little things. We will read from Timothy and hear the apostles asking the Lord to "Increase our faith!" The Biblical witness is lush with images that push our imaginations, brimming full with stories that call our motives into question, and comforting words of acceptance, love and grace which sustain us throughout our daily life. Please do plan to join in the reading, discussion, and Christian fellowship as we prepare ourselves for Sunday worship through Wednesday Bible study. (Do remember that September 7 is the first Wednesday of the month and street sweeping prevents parking on Springettsbury Ave.)

COVID-19 and Our Congregation

The COVID Task Force, comprised of members of our congregation, has been providing insights and caring for us throughout the pandemic. Most recently when the local county rate of infections became greater than 5% we moved from "Masks optional" to "Masks recommended." This move was mirrored with the change in signage on the entrances to the church, the weekly email commination, and within the Sunday Service Folder. At the Congregation Council Meeting additional clarification was given in the event the local rate of infection moves above 10% that we would return to "Masks required." By utilizing these three categories we hope that all worshipers will continue to participate and that all of us will remain safe from the spread of virus. If this summer follows the trends of the past two years then we foresee a local rate moving below 5%. Similarly toward the end of the year, late autumn, we may see an increase in the local rate of infection moving above 10%. 
God's Work Our Hands



The Council initiated conversations regarding staff compensation and any COLA for the 2023 budget year. They will be in communication with the Mutual Ministry committee as data is collated and publicized for the region and community.

The summer worship schedule was discussed. Attendance has remained solid. It was noted that the energy of the combined service was a welcome switch from past summer 8:00AM liturgies where attendance was often sparse.

The York History Center has responded to our request to have the carvings of the 4 Apostles returned to St. Paul's. The carvings were part of the pulpit at the previous church building destroyed by fire. Ann Anstadt and Pastor Reep will continue to work with the staff members and board of the history center to bring this to fruition.

The meeting concluded at 8:40PM with closing prayer offered by Tristan Ericson.
