





#### NICENE CREED

# **COMMUNION OF THE FAITHFUL**

Our Communion is "open" to all believers who trust that the Risen Christ is present for his people in the Holy Eucharist.

1. Come to communion using the center aisle (about 10 adults per side).

2. Communion glasses are placed on credence tables at the front pews (left and right side).

3. Take a communion glass from the tray of glasses.

4. Take your place along the chancel step. The ministers will bring the bread and wine to you.


5. Extend your hands to receive the communion host.

6. Consume the communion host.

7. Hold the communion glass with both hands at chest height so that the communion assistant can easily pour the wine into the glass.

8. Consume the wine before you leave the chancel edge.

9.Place the used cup in an empty tray located on a credence table at the side aisle. 10.Return to your pew using the side aisle.

#### Advent 1 A, 2022 Isaiah 2:1-5 Romans 13:11-14 Matthew 24:36-44

Advent is here; and with it invitations; to come to Mount Zion, to live honorably, and to stay awake. This is a season that is different from other seasons in our life together. Most of my adult life I have tried to keep Christmas from steamrolling over Advent. Most of the time it seems that I am just not much fun, a stick in the mud, holding out for some obscure reason when attempting to guard this holy Advent season. Time spent in reflection exposed weakness on my part that I haven't done a good job of inviting people into the critical themes revealed in this first Sunday's readings. Nor have I provided church members with something other than the tinsel and glitter and favorite carols and greens with bright red bows that accompany Christmas. I, however, remain a stalwart of the Advent invitation for us to enter into a season of the Word because it is real and needed.

The Prophet Isaiah invites us to the mountain of the Lord. Here it is that we will be provided instruction accompanied with the word of the Lord. The wedding of instruction and word of the Lord provides a situation where nations and peoples "*beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore.*" The prophet proclaims that it is the Lord who judges and it is the Lord who arbitrates and through such judging and arbitration the people learn something other than war. If we are learning something other than war, then we must be learning about peace, not peace at any cost, but peace as made known through the word of the Lord. Such an invitation is truly needed, such instruction is needed, and what, according to the Prophet Isaiah, brings it about is the word of the Lord.

The Apostle Paul invites us to live honorably. The invitation alone suggests that the people in Rome, the newly formed Christian community and us by extension, were living dishonorably. Paul sets the alarm clock announcing a new tone, salvation is near! My first alarm clock was a wind up version with two bells that announced the appointed set time. My second alarm clock was in the form of a clock radio so you could choose between; the annoying buzzing sound or your favorite radio station. With the advent of cell phones I discovered the nearly endless possibilities of tones and tunes to raise me from slumber. In ancient Rome as advanced as they were the announcement of the new day, the alarm was rather fixed and limited. Paul reminds the early Christian community of the nearness of salvation and the importance of honorable living making known a way of life reflective of Christ. He couches it in language as if in the morning when you get up and change out of your pajamas, you put on the Lord Jesus Christ, you dress yourself in the Lord Jesus and all of his hope, love, joy and peace. This is the clothing that we reference in baptism. It is the kind of clothing that reminds you and those with whom you come in contact that you belong to Christ, and as God's child you walk in his ways and reflect them to others.

The first gospel, Matthew, invites us to stay awake. It is easier to be awake if you know the schedule. It isn't so difficult to be ready if you are aware of the time. Matthew relays how Jesus told his disciples about vigilance in faith and following. "About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." And as example Jesus reminded them of the story of Noah; how suddenly all the fountains of the great deep burst forth, and the windows of the heavens were opened and the rain fell on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and Noah and his family were shut safely inside the ark which the Lord had commanded him to make. By further example we hear of the two women grinding meal to-gether and the person whose house is plundered. And then another plea to be ready, stay awake!

In late 2020 my minimum slowly began to self-destruct. After more than a decade of faithful service to me and several additional years to the previous owner, I suppose I should have been aware of the time. In those days I was carpooling Allen and two of the neighborhood children to the middle school each day. These were the days of the pandemic and we didn't want the kids to be confined on the school bus 40 minutes to school each day. First it was the CD player that gave out, then the AC gave out, and then the electric motor on the driver's side rear door gave out. But it was the day that the kids got out curb side at the middle school and the passenger's side rear door wouldn't close, when I physically had to get out and go around to the other side and wrestled the door closed stopping traffic and the flow of student drop off and as you well might imagine the embarrassment to three middle schoolers who walked away pretending that they didn't know me, that I decided to purchase a newer vehicle. I will not elaborate on student drop off procedure for the ensuing weeks where the three kids exited the van through the back lift gate! But the kids were elated that the new vehicle has doors that work. There are other fabulous features which I will not enumerate. But there is one feature that I have grown to appreciate. When driving along especially on longer trips occasionally you hear a simple non-threatening chime and an image of a coffee cup appears in red on the dash with the words, "Consider taking a break." The vehicle senses that I have drifted out of my lane and is kindly alerting me to the importance of a break in order to stay awake!

Today it is the Risen Ascended Lord announcing to us the importance of taking a break, of being ready. It is the Lord reminding us that in baptism we are set free from things that hold us and bind us, and that lure us away from his way of hope, love, joy and peace. He clothes us with forgiveness and life preparing us for the unexpected hour. *Consider taking a break* chimes the dashboard knowing that I have not been as attentive to my task. The word of the Lord comes to us in Jesus the righteous judge. His desire is that we are ready, awake, watchful, living as children of his light and life and love.

Often when I hear stay awake or keep awake what I miss is the importance of the "break." I miss the significance that I have drifted out of my lane, off of the right path, begun to drift taking a different course. To take time, pull over, rejuvenate, get rest, refuel, walk, and even if possible switch drivers is important and can be lifesaving. That is the call of Christ Jesus to us this morning on this first Sunday in Advent. Had I made this connection with the season of Advent earlier in ministry it may have been helpful for others. Rushing to Christmas only keeps "the peddle to the metal." It doesn't provide the break in our lives, a season that is needed in order to be ready, ready to engage with others about being clothed in Christ, about beating plowshares into pruning hooks, about the peace of Christ, and the readiness that makes for faithful confident living. The Advent lending library in the Good Shepherd Room may provide you with a resource to assist you in this break, a gift to take time, pull over, rejuvenate, get rest, refuel, walk, and even if possible switch drivers. The word of the Lord comes to us in this Advent season inviting us to a fuller, richer, way of life through Christ Jesus. He tells us, his followers "*Keep awake*!" Amen.

## FIRST READING: Isaiah 2:1-5

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

### <sup>2</sup>In days to come

the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. <sup>3</sup>Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. <sup>4</sup>He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

# Psalm 122

### SECOND READING: Romans 13:11-14

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from

sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; <sup>12</sup>the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; <sup>13</sup>let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. <sup>14</sup>Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

# GOSPEL: Matthew 24:36-44

[Jesus said to the disciples,] "About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. <sup>37</sup>For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>38</sup>For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, <sup>39</sup>and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>40</sup>Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. <sup>41</sup>Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. <sup>42</sup>Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. <sup>43</sup>But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. 44Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."
