4. Take your place along the chancel step. The ministers will bring the bread and wine to you. 5. Extend your hands to receive the communion host.

6. Consume the communion host.

7. Hold the communion glass with both hands at chest height so that the communion assistant can easily pour the wine into the glass.

8. Consume the wine before you leave the chancel edge.

9. *Place the used cup in an empty tray located on a credence table at the side aisle.* 10. *Return to your pew using the side aisle.*

Following the incredible snowfall in Buffalo New York a regional news station aired a story about a neighborhood auto body shop, and the increased volume of work generated through automobiles colliding with one another during inclement weather conditions. It seems that snow and ice on the road ways as well as the diminished sight lines created by giant snow banks work out in their advantage. Customers want vehicles repaired quickly. The auto body shop owner interviewed for the news story commented that during seasons like this when collisions are frequent they work seven days a week trying to keep up with the demand.

Collision happens when two things come together that are not in sync with one another. The dictionary definition, "The conflict of opposed ideas, wishes, attitudes, etc.: a collision of interests. Most automobile owners who find their vehicle a piece of mangled metal would prefer a collision of interests rather than a collision of fenders, hoods, bumpers, and trunks. And even if insurance will cover the financial cost of it all, the headache, inconvenience, and frustration make the entire experience even more draining.

Costly collision is born out of the kingdom of heaven and the kingdom of earth colliding. That's what is happening in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali in the wake of Jesus' presence. His appearance in the region north of Jerusalem and on the North West shore of the Sea of Galilee is causing conflict to the ideas and interests of those established in the region. John the Baptizer is arrested and put in jail. We heard John's subversive message week before last when he called out to people living on the edge of society to "Repent and be baptized." His message got the religious people in charge so worked up that they needed to go out and see and hear for themselves the radical message; a message that collided with theirs, a message that pointed to one who was to come, "*The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world*." That radical message collided with their message and so John the Baptizer is arrested and jailed in hopes to put him out of commission and to silence him.

But the headache, inconvenience and frustration that John's preaching has caused is nothing compared with Jesus' preaching, proclaiming the kingdom of heaven has come near, precisely because as the Son of God he has come near. He is present. The kingdom is here because Jesus is here. And not only is he here, but he is calling us to follow.

"Follow me" he says to regional fishermen in the seaside villages by Lake Galilee. "I will make you fish for people. And *"immediately they left their nets and followed him."*

I often wonder what it must have been like for old man Zebedee to go home after work that day without his two sons, his fishing partners, and most likely without any fish. The collision that must have transpired between Mrs. Zebedee and Mr. Zebedee when she finds out that her boys have dropped the nets and have followed the itinerant teacher, preacher, healer, Jesus. It must have been something like going home and telling your significant other that you totaled the car into an ice bank!

Jesus' call to follow confronts us where we are, in the midst of what we are doing, at an inconvenient time. Jesus confronts fishermen and tells then that they will fish for people. When Jesus confronted farmers, perhaps he challenged them to plant the seed of the gospel. Or fellow carpenters may have been invited to build the community of faith. Jesus calls us this morning to follow him. He confronts us in our 21st century lives encompassing a wide range of occupations and vocations;

Preachers proclaim the good news Doctors heal the suffering ones Educators teach the loving purpose Truck drivers haul and deliver mercy Plumbers keep the good news flowing Accountants track productivity Electricians shed light on the path Nurses patiently deliver caring Attorneys work for justice Chefs feed the hungry Secretaries prepare for the unexpected, delayed, misplaced and lost segments of the

Firefighters extinguish the burning passions of the world.

Jesus calls each of us to follow. We don't have to know anything about fishing nets, or trimming sails, or port or starboard, or how to hold the rudder or what kind of fish there are in the lake. He calls us to follow where we are, doing what it is that we do, using the skills and gifts that we have been given. And he calls us to specialized areas that may seem weird or unknown to us. But God calls. You might even give yourself a little slack and relax, you don't necessarily have to fish for people. I think you need to love them instead. You need to cast the net of God's love, mercy, forgiveness and grace as far and wide as you can in the occupation or vocation in which you find yourself. And when you do, you may very well discover a collision of ideas, wishes, and or attitudes. God's love in Christ Jesus regularly collides with the world's desire for self-serving self-centered action. Jesus' call to those first disciples moved them into relationship with Jesus, a new relationship with one another, and sent them out to proclaim a message of future promise. This from a bunch of guys who worked in concrete tangibles, like fish! Imagine what is possible among us gathered here this morning.

Costly collision, that's what happens when heaven breaks into earth. That's what is happening here this morning in the presence of Jesus. He calls us to follow. He wants disciples to proclaim, heal, teach, drive, flow, illumine, deliver, track, work, feed, seek, find, welcome, and put out the raging fires that threaten life, your life and mine.

In Christ's love for us he collided with those seeking power and prestige, position and title. The heavens thundered and the earth rumbled and Jesus died on Calvary's tree. This collision is rarely mentioned on regional news or in local shops. It is the story of love so deep and wide and forgiving and merciful that there are some who try to avoid it at all costs. But occasionally weather conditions will be in our favor and we will collide with someone who desperately needs to hear that there is a way forward. Jesus says "Come follow me." Amen.

Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? 14I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to

proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

¹⁸For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

GOSPEL: Matthew 4:12-23

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. ¹³He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, ¹⁴so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

¹⁵"Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali,

on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—

¹⁶the people who sat in darkness

have seen a great light,

and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death

light has dawned."

¹⁷ From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

¹⁸As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea for they were fishermen. ¹⁹And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." ²⁰Immediately they left their nets and followed him. ²¹As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. ²²Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him.
