Holy Week Schedule and Liturgical Notes Palm Sunday, Sunday of the Passion April 2, 2023 9:15 AM

The liturgy begins with the Chancel Choir singing a stirring arrangement of Ride on

King Jesus followed by the blessing of palm branches. The traditional processional hymn *All Glory Laud and Honor* will be sung as the congregation takes part in procession. Following the Prayer of the Day we receive new members into the life of the congregation. The scripture readings point us directly to the power of God at working bringing salvation to humankind. The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Matthew is read proclaiming powerfully God's love for us and all people. Holy Communion will be celebrated and the congregation takes their leave stirred now by the story of God's compassionate action on our behalf.

Maundy Thursday April 6, 2023 7:00 PM

We begin the solemn Three Days. The liturgy on Maundy Thursday begins with the sermon. This is a rather jarring beginning from our traditional liturgical pattern. We do this in

order that the sermon provides direction and insight into the Holy Week events. Of notable change, the Handbell Choir will ring a dramatic anthem based on the hymn *My Song is Love Unknown*. We will hear of the new commandment given to us by our Lord Jesus *That we love one another* both through the Gospel reading from St. John and by a beautiful setting sung by the Chancel Choir. We will recall how the supper was instated by Christ himself and how the Apostle Paul handed it on to the Church in Corinth and through time to us. The liturgy concludes with the stripping of the Altar. While the chancel appointments are being removed, the Chancel Choir sings Psalm 88. The service ends in complete silence. There is not a benediction as this is one part of a liturgy extending over three days.

Good Friday April 7, 2023 7:00 PM

On Good Friday the focus of our liturgical life centers on the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ from the Gospel of St. John. The Chancel Choir will render the Psalm and a response

to the reading will be offered by violin and organ based on John 3:16, *For God so Loved the World*, to a setting by Charles Callahan. The prayers are in the form of a spoken litany and we conclude with the Reproaches of the Cross. The veil is removed from large wooden cross as we acknowledge that is was upon the hard wood of the cross that our savior bore the sin or the world. Worshipers are invited to reverence the cross as they take their leave from the sanctuary. Once again, there is no benediction as this is the second part of a liturgy extending over three days.

Holy Saturday, The Vigil of Easter April 8, 2023 7:00 PM

The Great Vigil of Easter is one of the most important liturgies in Christianity. Here we hear how God through time as brought Salvation to humankind and how our Lord Jesus passes from death to life. We begin at the Garden of Memory on the south lawn. A new fire is kindled and from it the Paschal candle is lighted. We process into the church nave and take candle light from the Paschal candle spreading its flame to the hand candles of worshipers as the Easter Proclamation is sung by the cantor. Then we sit. The daylight fades in the worship space as we hear readings from scripture. There are 12 appointed readings from which we select about half a dozen each year to read giving shape to our understanding of God's work in histo-









ry from creation through the Prophet Daniel. If there are candidates for Holy Baptism the assembly enters into the Baptismal rite. If there aren't any baptisms scheduled then the liturgy proceeds with the Affirmation of Baptism for all who have gathered. A hymn focusing our attention on Baptism is sung. Then together we pray the Litany. When the prayers end the church is dark and then suddenly the morning light of Easter breaks in as we sing an Easter hymn in the brilliance of the church nave. Spring flowers appear in the church. Dazzling white paraments grace the pulpit and altar. The account of the Resurrection of Our Lord from St. John is read followed by the sharing of The Peace. Servers prepare the altar for the first celebration of Easter and Holy Communion is celebrated. The liturgy that has extended over three days concludes with the Easter Proclamation; *Christ is Risen, He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!*

The Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Day April 9, 2023 9:15 AM

One combined liturgy on Sunday morning will make our Easter joy and celebration complete. The prelude will feature Brass and Organ. The Church nave and chancel will be beautifully appointed with spring flowers. The Chancel Choir will lead us in the liturgy and hymns.



We will use *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* musical setting #9 for the liturgy. We will use for the first time *This is the Feast* from this setting. It will be placed as our first communion hymn. The Easter Day liturgy is straight forward following the tradition form of the mass. A Confirmand will serve as lector. The sermon will announce the good news that God has acted bring us life and salvation. Following the liturgy the Fellowship Committee is providing light refreshments in the George Street narthex, the Good Shepherd Room, and weather permitting outside by the playground. Please plan to come. Invite friends and family members to join you, especially those who may not have attended for some time. And do plan to share in the fellowship time following the liturgy. May your joy be full and may Easter provide you with renewed hope.

Mpuguso Scholarship Recipients

These pictures of these fine-looking and smart young men and women are twelve of the fourteen students who are receiving scholarships from St. Paul's Lutheran Church to further their education. These scholarships, amounting to \$9,000, are provided through the monetary gifts given in our regular offerings; the cost of these scholarships were part of our benevolent expenditures in our congregational budget adopted at our Congregation Meeting. Thank you all for your generous giving which made these scholarships possible.

Since 2006, St. Paul's has been providing scholarships for students selected by the Bishop of the Konde Diocese. These students all have been the children of pastors and church workers. During his time with us while studying at York College on a scholarship from St. Paul's, Pastor Meshack Njinga explained to our congregation how difficult it is for the children of pastors and church workers to continue their education past primary school. In Tanzania, education in primary school is free to all. However, to continue on into secondary school, students must pass exams and must pay tuition. Because of the low salaries received by pastors and church workers few of their children were able to continue their education past primary school; and they all realize that education is essential to get ahead in life. Since 2006 through scholarship aid, St. Paul's has provided a way for many students to get ahead in life.

These twelve students have been selected by the current Bishop, Bishop Geoffrey Mwakahaba to receive scholarship aid this year. They are all in Form One (the equivalent of seventh grade in our educational system). They are all attending Manow Lutheran Seminary (Secondary School), a school sponsored by the Konde Diocese. It is our hope and prayer that we will continue scholarship aid for these students until they graduate from the Seminary. As we receive more information about the scholarship recipients, we will share this information with you.—Tom McKee

The Acts of the Apostles is a continuation of the narrative of

Congregation Council Highlights

The Congregation Council gathered for their regularly scheduled meeting on Monday March 13 at 6:30 PM in Christ Hall. President Ann Anstadt led the group in devotions and prayer. The devotions were on *"Lending a Hand"* remembering that as God's people we are not called upon to fix things but simply to lend a hand.



The Minutes of the February 13th meeting were approved as presented.

The Treasurer presented the monthly receipts and expenses and noted that we are on track with the budget. His report was approved as presented. The recommendation from the Finance Committee to purse a relationship with Hamillen and Musser, since RKL informed us that they are no longer willing to perform our audit, was approved. At this point we are in conversation about Agreed upon Procedures for the congregation's daily operations. Also approved was the recommendation that the money received from the closure of Boy Scout Troup 19's checking account be used to purchase backpacking equipment for Camp Kirchenwald.

The Property Committee is waiting to hear back from M&M architectural firm with first drawings for a canopy for Pantry walkway area. The Diakon property will need some attention to the interior. Estimates for the work are in process. Joan Henney from the city of York provided resources on safety and a copy of *Mitigating Attacks on Houses of Worship*. This will continue to inform and reshape the tasks associated with serving as Usher on Sunday morning.

A Council and Committee Chairperson retreat will be held on Saturday April 22 from 8:00 - 11:30 AM. The retreat will be held in Christ Hall.

The request of Social Ministry to have a SERRV Sale on April 23 & 30 was approved. It was noted that as changes are made to the Food Pantry ministry to meet growing demands that care must be taken not to exceed the room capacity. The finished set of architectural drawings will be consulted to ascertain the number of persons permitted in the room.
