The conversations were lively as people sampled white port and tonic spritzers. Violin music, provided by Andrew Jones, wafted through the church nave. The paintings donat-



ed by Pastor Reep to benefit the Food Pantry were displayed across the front of the chancel. After viewing them and sharing in conversation everyone moved to the Fellowship Hall for a delicious dinner. Among the many beautiful donated silent auction items, one listing was incredibly popular. Rev. George Fitch crafted several pairs of bookends utilizing elements garnered from the church nave renovation. The acorn turnings that once graced the communion rail and brass fittings from the former chandeliers were uniquely fashioned together creating one of a kind historical art pieces. Nine of Pastor Reep's paintings were put up at the live auction. Seven of the images appeared on the pages of the 2023 St. Paul's calendar. Two paintings were newly completed at the conclusion of his sabbatical time. These were large scale works, one a dining room still life the other a lakeside landscape. The bidding on both was ferocious! The evening concluded at 8:30 PM with folks joyfully taking their leave. The Harvest Dinner Event netted \$18,000 for the Food Pantry. Grateful appreciation is extended to the committee, Chef Greg Mummert, the volunteers, those who donated items, those who purchased tickets, and especially those who willingly entered into the fun of bidding knowing that in the end the hungry are fed.


have the opportunity to support the preschool and purchase a shirt. Stay tuned for more information.





The Confirmation Program at St. Paul's is designed to cover the basic portions of Luther's Small Catechism, church history and navigating the Bible. These basic tools assist our young people as they grow in grace, faith and love. Congregation Council Highlights

The Congregation Council gathered for their monthly meeting in Christ Hall on Monday October 9, 2023 at 7:00 PM. The meeting began with prayer offered by Chris Lipp.

The Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday November 19, 2023 following the 10:30 AM liturgy. The Fellowship Committee is providing the noon meal.

Dan Mays, fellow council member, is receiving physical therapy and has been added to the prayer list.

Nominations for Congregation Council, Benevolence, Mutual Ministry and Synod voting member should be submitted to the nominating committee prior to the November 13 council meeting.

The Treasurer provided the monthly report. As was reported last month offerings continue to be less than previous year. This was brought to the attention of the Finance and Stewardship committees. The trend will be researched to gain clarification. All committee spending was in line with the 2023 budget.

The 2024 Proposed Budget presented by the Finance Committee was approved for presentation to the congregation at the Annual meeting on Sunday November 19. (A copy of the proposed budget is included with this mailing.)

The request to receive offerings for *God's Global Barnyard* was approved for the Lenten Season 2024. Historically this has taken place during the Advent Season but this year the period of Advent is shorter as Advent 4 and Christmas Eve are both December 24.

The Council approved the request of Preschool to hold a T-Shirt fundraiser. Congregation members may order T-Shirts during the month of November.

The Council supports combining for worship at 8:00 AM with St. Peter's Lutheran Church North George Street, York PA for the Epiphany Season (January 8 – February 11) with St. Paul's hosting. Pastors Schlegel and Reep will work collaboratively in planning, leading and preaching at the 8:00 AM liturgies. A time of fellowship will follow each Sunday liturgy.

The Council approved the recommendations from Worship and Arts. 1. That a soprano and alto metallophone be purchased from West Music to support the children's music program. The purchase is to come from the McElhiney Music Fund. 2. The Christmas Season Worship Schedule: Sunday, December 24, Advent 4 – Combined 9:15AM liturgy, Christmas Eve 4:00 & 7:00 PM, Monday, December 25, Christmas Day 10:30 AM. Sunday, December 31, The First Sunday after Christmas – Combined 9:15 AM liturgy.

The Council approved the recommendations from Property. 1. Complete the digital signage in the Good Shepherd Room and Upper Level hallway with monitors linking live stream and information for congregation and preschool. 2. Sanctuary Video Streaming Upgrades with additional camera and monitor.

The Stewardship Committee has provided for Commitment Sunday to be held October 22 and has arranged for the service and fellowship meals following each liturgy. Guest preacher is the Rev. Beth Martini.

The meeting concluded with prayer at 8:30 PM.
