Mission Trip - Mpuguso Lutheran Church, Tukuyu, Tanzania June 10-22, 2024

The mission team continues to gather in preparation for the summer journey to Tanzania. On March 6 they finalized the list of mission travelers, confirmed the large pieces of the itinerary, and established the need to meet with a level of frequency to strengthen relationships with one another as they prepare for departure, June 10. Those traveling from St. Paul's are: Cameron and Maggie Dickerson, Tristan and Jessica Ericson and their children Ezra and Iris, Laura Uffelman-Ferree, Steve and Sue Heistand, Scott and Nicki Herdson and their children Anna, Paul and Drew, Keith and Chris-



tine Kates, Kass Keleta, Jaclyn Kinkella, Tina Llorente, Elizabeth Uffelman-Mitchell, Pastor Reep and Emily and Allen, and Cheryl Reifsteck.

At the April 17th afternoon session mission goals were shared and ranged from good health while traveling to safe return to St. Paul's and York. But in between those goals were others highlighting the spiritual dimension, the desire to learn from sisters and brothers at Mpuguso Church and the Konde Diocese, experience firsthand their culture, and identify ways to strengthen relationships in their work and mission together in Christ Jesus. Also included was the desire to have fun, hiking, exploring and enjoying a completely new and unique country. None of the mission travelers has been to Tanzania.

Already new relationships have formed with another Lutheran congregation in USA, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, Olympia, WA. They contacted St. Paul's travelers to see if they could provide transport for some much needed lap top computers for the computer lab and Manow Lutheran Junior Seminary. Nancy Winters, member of Gloria Dei Church, has taught many times at the school in Tanzania and her congregation supports students in preparing for the English language exam needed to enter Form One (what we would consider Junior High School). She has passed along valuable information from a basic packing list, what to take and what to leave behind, to being sensitive to cultural norms that vary differently from what is experienced in USA. And they have become more connected to Deacon April Trout, ELCA and Synod representative to Konde Diocese. She met with the mission group at a planning meeting held in November of 2023. Deacon April has provided enormously to the overall cohesiveness of the trip. She has arranged for components of the trip that the international travel agency could not provide due to the rural geographic setting of St. Paul's sister congregation. Currently she is working with the Bishop of the Konde Diocese and his staff to shape the daily itinerary while the group is in Tukuyu.

Deacon April inquired of Pastor Reep about the group of travelers assuming that they are all involved with the congregation's mission committee. As it turns out, more of them participate in the Handbell Choir than any other area of ministry at St. Paul's! So Deacon April suggested that they consider ringing an anthem or two while in Tukuyu as part of the Sunday Service on June 16. Cameron Dickerson, mem-

ber of the group of travelers, sent out an inquiry among congregations in local community to see if any might have a set of Tone Chimes (handbells would be too heavy, expensive and cumbersome to pack) that they might wish to donate or sell at a reasonable rate (a new two octave set of Tone Chimes lists at \$1,200). The idea of course would be for the travelers to learn an anthem or two to play at the corner stone laying celebration and then present the Mpuguso congregation with a set of Tone Chimes for use in their future music ministry.

Those who will be representing St. Paul's have taken on great expense and have set aside a great deal of time. Three of the mission travelers are retired, seven are students, and 14 are working. Medical insurance does not cover the cost of the vaccines needed to enter Tanzania. The average cost associated is about \$300 per person. Another cost is for the Visa need to enter the country it is \$100 per person. The Women of St. Paul's graciously provided the necessary funds to cover trip cancelation insurance. Funds that exceeded the insurance are being used as scholarships to assist travelers for whom this trip could not otherwise be possible. Donations from members of the congregation are also being used for this purpose. And you may remember from the Annual Meeting of the Congregation last November that a grant from the Benevolence Fund provided \$1,000 to assist each participant. All of these resources are being used in support of this mission trip.

This is the largest group of travelers from USA and the ELCA that the Konde Diocese has ever received. This is an enormous undertaking for them. The hope is that any additional gifts given in support of our team will be given to the congregation and diocese to off-set expenses associated with transportation and meals for our group while they are in Tukuyu. To that end, St. Paul's own Mpuguso Committee is sponsoring a Mother's Day Bake Sale, May 12, to support this effort. More about the bake sale is included in this edition of the newsletter. If you would like to help with the bake sale; bake, set up, oversee the sale, clean up, or donate financially please contact Martina Uffelman, committee member and Bake Sale Coordinator.

What have not been shared are the long term implications of this trip on the St. Paul's congregation. Deepening the Christian fellowship of 24 members of any faith community is an astounding feat. But to deepen them through international travel, shared experience, learning first-hand the joys and struggles of sisters and brothers, and returning to communicate within the congregation and synod is sure to reap bountifully for everyone. The monetary cost associated with this mission trip will pale in comparison to the relationships formed; ministry opportunities created and sustained, and renewed commitment to the Gospel of Christ Jesus and his love, forgiveness and hope proclaimed for all people. This mission trip is a mile stone for the congregation and for Pastor Reep who will complete his 20th year of service to St. Paul's Church on July 31! Please do pray for those going on the mission trip and for those receiving them in Tanzania. Help with the congregation's efforts to support this trip. And continue to share with others the good news of the work and mission being made known through our Lord, Christ Jesus.



The Congregation Council along with committee chairpersons gathered in retreat on Saturday, March 9, from 8:00 – 11:30 AM in Christ Hall. President Nicki Herdson provided a time of devotion and prayer centering on the theme "Good Enough." Following devotions the group enjoyed brunch and began the work assigned for the day. Those gathered were divided into small groups. The



small groups responded to a list of prepared questions ranging from "How was it that you become involved in the life of St. Paul's Church" to "What is the most meaningful aspect of our life together in Christ Jesus." After being given ample time to listen empathetically to one another, teammate's collated responses, organized them by themes and ranked them from most similar responses to ones that were only identified once or twice. Then the teams presented their findings to the entire group. Thematic similarities were easily identified among the five groups. Each group also identified some things that were unique. From the day we identified the importance of the centrality of Christ Jesus to our life together, our core commitments, basic Lutheran teaching and identity, Christology, ministry areas that we support and began to have a clearer picture and knowledge of who we are as God's people. The specifics of the day will be used to shape areas of ministry led by our committee chairpersons, enliven our annual meeting in November, and support the Congregation Council as they work through monthly agendas. There was one business matter that came before the council regarding a sandwich sale to benefit the preschool. The motion was approved. 

What's New in the Pantry?

During March we had representatives from Central Penn Food Bank (CPFB) in Harrisburg come to talk to our neighbors about enrolling in the <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)</u> (formally food stamps).
