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WELCOME Thank you for being with us.





Dear friend, we rejoice that you now desire to make public profession of your faith and assume greater responsibility in the life of our Christian community and its mission in the world.

## **RENUNCIATION OF EVIL**

Beloved of the Lord: In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you a member of his Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from his Word God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been nourished at his holy table and called to be a witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Now, therefore, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises? *The Confirmand responds "I do."*





#### THANKSGIVING

You are indeed holy, O God, the fountain of all holiness;

### Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

- Therefore, O God, with this bread and cup we remember the incarnation of your Son: his human birth and the covenant he made with us.
- We remember the sacrifice of his life:

his eating with outcasts and sinners, and his acceptance of death.

- But chiefly on this day we remember his rising from the tomb, his ascension to the seat of power, and his sending of the holy and life-giving Spirit.
- We cry out for the resurrection of our lives, when Christ will come again in beauty and power to share with us the great and promised feast.

#### Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Send now, we pray, your Holy Spirit, that we and all who share in this bread and cup may be united in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, may enter the fullness of the kingdom of heaven, and may receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.

#### Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.

Join our prayers with those of your servants of every time and every place, and unite them with the ceaseless petitions of our great high priest until he comes as victorious Lord of all.

#### Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. Amen.





#### Easter 6 B, 2024 Acts 10:44-48 1 John 5:1-6 St. John 15:9-17

"On demand" has been marketed to our society. I first remember it being used when the cable TV company Comcast rebranded to Xfinity with the tag line "on demand." I suspect that it was marketed as a solution to the "shrinking" amount of hours in a day because of the many "demands" placed upon us; work, home, family, school, government, and everything else associated with "adult-ing" in modern culture. And it provided an innocuous platform for maximizing time spent absorbing the sports, news, and entertainment industries. It was possible through new technologies.

Now it seems that "On Demand" culture has swallowed us up. I suppose "on demand" was the next logical progression to grow out of the "instant culture" with things like "fast food," instant oatmeal and microwaves. I'm not knocking it, I am simply trying to identify the patterns that change culture, move it from one thing to another, making it seem normal, ordinary, and an essential part of daily life.

You would expect this from me. Attempting to live out my calling as a Baptized child of God and as a pastor of the Church, I am part of a different culture. This is the culture in which Blake will soon confess his faith and pledge to take a more active part. And Blake and I are not alone in this enterprise as we are surrounded by you, the baptized who are also called to live life swallowed up in the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ. His victory over sin, death and the devil, establishes patterns that change culture, move it from one thing to another, making the culture of Christ Jesus; normal, ordinary, and essential to daily life for the baptized. We hear of this shift in society and culture in all three of the readings this morning.

Peter has just delivered bold proclamation of the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. While he is speaking the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. The Holy Spirit was poured out even on the most unlikely of folks, the Gentiles. Here God is at work bringing unlikely groups of people together. And together they extoll God. This led to Cornelius and his family, along with everyone else upon whom the Holy Spirit fell that day, to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. They become part of a people swallowed up in the victory of our Lord. They are people for whom patterns for daily life and living will change; soon gathering for daily prayer, sharing their resources, participating in the Holy Meal, and caring for others will become a shift running contrary to their present culture.

In First John we hear of a societal shift flowing from the love of the Father to the Son, and the Son to his fellow believers. This love that the Father has bestowed moves believers to obey his commandments. And as the text reminds us, His commandments are not burdensome. Loving God and loving neighbor changes the culture of the world. The text uses "conquers the world" and these days with the prevalence of the military aggression going on in the world "Conquers" does sound a bit militaristic, but the faith that is ours through the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ, moves us to live the command to love. And love establishes patterns that change culture, move it from one thing to another, making the culture of Christ Jesus; normal, ordinary, and essential to daily life. Swallowed up in the victory of our Lord Jesus Christ the gospel writer John opens us to the love of Jesus for the Disciples. This is the same love that the Father has for Jesus, the Son. This love is given, bestowed; sharing in Divine love is what followers do. Abide in Jesus' love. This love is ongoing, continually present, renewing constantly.

On my computer I need to click on the "refresh" icon periodically to bring things into the present moment. Otherwise I am only able to view items that are frozen in time. But I am not accessing anything currently in the present. The love that we hear about in the gospel of John, and the love that is given to us through Christ Jesus, is abiding love; ongoing, continually present, renewing constantly. It is as though the "refresh" icon is constantly being employed to keep God's love made known to us in Christ Jesus in the "now."

In Acts those who were swallowed up in the victory of the Lord Jesus were extolling God. In First John those who were swallowed up in the victory of the Lord Jesus keep his commandments. In the gospel it is Joy, doing the will of the Father, that changes the culture of community and society. Here Jesus calls his followers "friends" and he does this because the relationship is changed. We are no longer servants, not knowing what the master may or may not do or how our future may be changed and impacted by such actions of the master. We are called friends because Jesus has made know to us everything that he has heard from the Father. We are promised a future that is consistent with the love bestowed on the Son, Christ Jesus, by the Father. His victory over sin, death, and the devil, swallows you up in a love that will not let you go. It is a love that is; abiding, renewing, everlasting for you and for me and for all who come to believe.

In this new relationship as friend, Jesus has chosen us to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last. This lasting fruit is the kind of fruit that does not perish, decay, rots. It is nonperishable. It is the kind of fruit referenced in Paul's letter to the Galatians; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, self-control. And as his friends we take seriously what Jesus takes seriously. Earthly human friendships can be fickle. When both parties don't take seriously the things that bring joy, cause pain, extend future, the friendships can easily wither, decay, rots. In Christ Jesus friendship hinges on keeping his commandments, taking seriously what Jesus desires.

The resurrected Lord Jesus comes among us to save us not so that we can revel in salvation and lord it over others as a kind of badge that we are better, but rather to bear fruit; going and loving others modeling his selflessness; selflessness manifest through his own suffering, death, resurrection and ascension. We experience his love in the forgiveness of our sins. He gives us the power to forgive, and there, in the midst of forgiveness there is love. This love, the love of God made known in Christ Jesus is not available on demand. The command to love is a sort of Bible language reminding us that the Father wills that the children of his love give themselves to one another freely. And that freely given love establishes patterns that change culture, move it from one thing to another, making the culture of Christ Jesus; normal, ordinary, and essential to daily life and living. Amen.

#### Sixth Sunday of Easter

#### FIRST READING: Acts 10:44-48

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. <sup>45</sup>The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, <sup>46</sup>for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, <sup>47</sup>"Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" <sup>48</sup>So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

#### Psalm 98

#### SECOND READING: 1 John 5:1-6

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. <sup>2</sup>By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. <sup>3</sup>For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, <sup>4</sup>for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. <sup>5</sup>Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? <sup>6</sup>This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

#### GOSPEL: John 15:9-17

[Jesus said:] "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. <sup>10</sup>If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. <sup>11</sup>I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

<sup>12</sup>"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup>No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. <sup>14</sup>You are my friends if you do what I command you. <sup>15</sup>I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. <sup>16</sup>You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. <sup>17</sup>I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another."
