only has the dinner raised significant funds it has served as a catalyst to strengthen bonds within the congregation. It has also provided an opportunity to invite members of the York community into our church facility and share with them the extensive help provided to the neighborhood through the weekly distribution. Sharing the story, the work and witness, the love and care, and the obedience to the words of our Savior to "*feed the hungry*" falls under the classic Christian theme of Evangelism. Mostly we shy away from evangelism. There are a variety of reasons for this. Sometimes it is because we don't know exactly what to say. Sometimes it is because we are uncertain of how such news of Jesus' love will be received. And sometimes it is because we think that it is the work of professionally trained persons, like pastors and deacons, and Christian education and youth directors. One of the many fabulous aspects of the Harvest Dinner is that through a totally enjoyable evening, dinner and conversation, the story of God's love in Christ Jesus is given expression. The command of Jesus to be neighbor, "go and do likewise," is easily accomplished by those participating, donating, giving, working, bidding, and buying.

At the end of the evening a \$125 ticket has marvelously been added with those of others gathered around the tables and those who secured winning bids scoring multiple thousands for the Food Pantry ministry (netting over \$25,000 last year). Please attend this event. We need you and your friends to join us. If you have participated in the past then you know firsthand the delightful time you will have at the Harvest Dinner. Commandments. There are two special Sundays where the youth will gather with others for intergenerational events: October 13 and November 24.





The Congregation Council gathered for their regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, September 16, at 6:30

PM in Christ Hall. The meeting began with devotions and prayer offered by Pastor Reep.

Ad Hoc committee to address pastoral needs up-date. Talking about their work during the cottage meetings and alerting members to the importance of complete survey questions when they are emailed during the month of October.

Members of St. Paul's will travel to St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Littlestown to share a presentation on the recent trip to Tanzania. They will be with them during the Sunday school hour, provided a temple talk prior to worship, and will go to lunch with council members.

The Nominating Committee's work begins. Dave Kopp, Nance Bennett, and Steve Schedin are committee members. Opportunities range from 4 persons to serve on council, 3 people to serve on Mutual Ministry (one partial term) and 1 person for the Benevolence Committee.

The recommendation of the Property Committee to purchase and install security upgrades for the Springettsbury Ave. entrance through Pro Tech was approved at a cost of \$3,565. This includes the camera, door lock, audio and installation. Pro Tech was selected because they provide monitoring for our existing security system.

The council approved and elected Keith Kates as the Assistant Treasurer of the congregation. He will begin to assume some of the treasurer duties and work in collaboration with Sheridan during the budget process.

Budget requests must be provided to the Treasurer by October 1. The Treasurer will prepare a draft of the 2025 budget for council preview at the October 21st meeting.

The final revision of the 2025 calendar, *Experiencing Tanzania* is complete and has been submitted to the printer. This year copies of the calendar will be provided to the Synod for inclusion with the Bishop's appeal letter to congregations in support of the Mbeya Hospital construction project. All proceeds from the calendar are designated for the Mbeya Hospital in the Konde Diocese.

The Meeting concluded at 7:30 PM with closing prayer offered by Chris Lipp.
