
Holy Communion at St. Paul's Church is "open" to all believers who trust that the Risen Christ is present for his people in the Holy Eucharist.

The Presentation of Our Lord, 2025

Malachi 3:1-4 Hebrews 2:14-18 Luke 2:22-40

Rendezvous, when you hear the word you may think of a secret liaison. You may even think of romantic affairs of the heart, Valentine's Day is quickly approaching. A rendezvous brings people together and brings about something new. We just experienced that with the Sacrament of Holy Baptism for Hannah Louise. Holy Baptism has brought all of us together and God has united this new sister with the entire community of faith. Sometimes it takes a lot of choreography to have a rendezvous. How on earth will persons from differing locations, schedules, and energy levels meet up to bring something, an idea, a hope, to fruition?

The Synod Konde Committee has planned an educational event for the last Sunday of this month at Advent Lutheran Church here in York. As part of the event members from St. Paul's will present a power point of the mission trip from last summer. Miss Kelly and I will assist participants in making a brightly colored Swahili sign to take home. Others will meet to discuss issues in Tanzania facing women in ministry. Another group will respond to questions about travelling to visit a sister congregation and to find out if there is interest to travel in 2026. While there are many aspects of the event, the idea to have a 5K walk/run to raise money and awareness for the new hospital in Mbeya, became part of the planning. The 5K would take place in the spring, the Sunday after Easter. A small group would of course be needed to work out the details, leverage support, secure volunteers, and develop merch (the free items used to promote the event and to take home as a sort of prize. I have learned that merch is really important!)

This sounds relatively simple and straight forward but the choreography to have a rendezvous has been complicated. Zoom meetings, emails, texts, confirmation of date and time and place, only to be postponed by circumstances. Add into the mix an old fashioned phone call. All of this in order for Zach Weise, camp director, and me to meet up, to rendezvous, to make a way forward for the Mbeya hospital synod fundraiser.

There are many moving parts. There are some things that bring about the rendezvous beyond the obvious; Zoom, email, text and phone:

Commitment to the cause,

Faithfulness in living for others,

The importance of relationships and friendships,

Devoted to the mission,

Supportive of others,

Vibrant hope for the future,

And the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The result of the choreography is a rendezvous which makes God's love in Christ known to the world. You might miss all of this when you see and hear announcements for Mbeya Hospital 5K walk/run, but what appears to be simple and ordinary is actually quite extraordinary.

We hear of the extraordinary choreography resulting in the rendezvous at the temple 40 days after Jesus was born. Commitment, faithfulness, relationships, devotion, and vibrant hope brought together Mary, Joseph, Jesus, Simeon and Anna. This rendezvous is not the result of God coercing the participants to come together, but in the obedience of the human actors who by their actions bring about God's divine purpose. The mission of God's love for the world as made known through his only Son is advancing. The mission is advancing because of commitment, obedience, duty, faithfulness, responsibility, worship and prayer. And it is collective; in other words, it is not just the commitment, obedience, duty, faithfulness, responsibility, and prayer of one person, but of each of them; Mary and Joseph, Simeon and Anna, each bring something when they gather at the temple on that day of the presentation of Jesus.

Mary and Joseph take their new born son and go to the temple because of their obedience to the Law of Moses, their devout faith, their knowledge of the scriptures, and their responsibility as parents and members of a faith community. Simeon is at the temple serving. He is priest and prophet; he is patient, obedient, and guided by the Spirit. Ann is at the temple because she is a prophet and as an aged widow, she has no place else to be, and she has devoted her life to prayer. And she embodies vibrant hope! And Jesus, a first born male child, Holy to the Lord, is presented and through the rendezvous the divine purpose of God is revealed, that Jesus is the Lord's Messiah. He is the one to bring about consolation for Israel. Simeon sings, Joseph and Mary are amazed, Anna praised God and began to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

You may not be looking for the redemption of Jerusalem, you may not long for consolation, and you may not have any notion of why the Lord's Messiah is at the heart of this rendezvous. But as human actors we gather together guided by the Holy Spirit, as members of a faith community, devoted to Christ Jesus, shaped and formed through the scriptures, liturgy and song to bear witness to his consoling and redeeming word for the world. What looks to many like folks meeting up at the corner of South George Street and Springettsbury Avenue to while away an hour or so of their morning for no good reason, has everything to do with God's divine purpose and the Lord's Messiah being made known. *In his Temple Now Behold Him* we sang at the beginning of this liturgy. The Lord's Messiah, the Christ Child of Bethlehem, Jesus, son of Mary has brought us together presenting us to God. He comes among us forgiving our grievous sin, redeeming us from our wrongs and consoling us in our grief and despair. The choreography making all of this possible began with a triumphant entry into a holy city with shouts of hosanna and garments and branches of palm strewn on the path, the path that lead to arrest, unjust sentencing, and carrying a cross to a hill upon which he was crucified.

This is the extraordinary story of God extending love to you, love that will not let you go, love that brings redemption, consolation, and vibrant hope. Such redemption, consolation and vibrant hope filled the temple on the 40th day when Joseph and Mary presented their first born son Jesus at the temple. Such redemption, consolation and vibrant hope are manifest here this morning in the presence of the Lord, Christ Jesus. Today he makes himself known to us in the sacramental word at the font and altar. This rendezvous has brought us together to share in God's gracious forgiveness and abundant mercy so that we can, as Simeon sang, "go in peace." And as we peacefully go, the light of Christ is brightening the way for all people. Amen.

FIRST READING: Malachi 3:1-4

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. ²But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; ³he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the LORD in righteousness. ⁴Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

Psalm 84 or Psalm 24:7-10

SECOND READING: Hebrews 2:14-18

Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, [Jesus] himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, ¹⁵and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. ¹⁶For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. ¹⁷Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. ¹⁸Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

GOSPEL: Luke 2:22-40

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, [Mary and Joseph] brought [Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³(as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), ²⁴and they offered a sacrifice

according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons."

²⁵Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. ²⁶It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, ²⁸Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

²⁹"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace,

according to your word;

³⁰for my eyes have seen your salvation,

³¹which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

32a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

³³And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. ³⁴Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too."

³⁶There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.
