


#### **PREFACE**



### COMMUNION OF THE FAITHFUL Sit


Holy Communion at St. Paul's Church is "open" to all believers who trust that the Risen Christ is present for his people in the Holy Eucharist.

### Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18 Philippians 3:17-4:1 Luke 13:31-35

Family road trips are a part of life. When I was kid it was securing a bright red canoe to the top of a 20 foot long midnight blue Mercury, piling into the back seat and heading to the river to spend time with cousins. It was beneficial if someone remembered to pack the paddles as well as the life jackets and picnic supplies! As an adult it was driving to the Outer Banks of North Carolina. The first few years my wife and I made the trip without the joy of children, and then later with the joy of children. What I remember most are the kids laughing in the back of the minivan as they were mesmerized by the Pixar movie *The Incredibles!* For nearly a decade I had never seen the movie only new it from the sound track. Whatever the reason or occasion a road trip brings out the best in us and the worst in us. And right now you may be caught up in the sheer joy of remembering a trip of your own or its looming downward spiral remembering unfortunate events that led to conflict and angst. But either way, you are aware of road trips and how they can quickly change from delight to conflict. "Dad, he's poking me again." "She keeps putting her smelly socks in my face!" and so the journey continues on.

Jesus is on a road trip. He is heading to Jerusalem. He has been teaching the disciples and crowds who have assembled along the way. And at certain intervals the religious leaders meet up with him too. He has sent people out in mission. He told stories about a being a good neighbor, a foolish rich man and a mustard seed. He took time to visit Martha and Mary in their home and taught the Disciples how to pray. People were thrilled when he cast out unclean spirits and a bit perplexed when he denounced the elite. He encouraged his followers not to be fearful and let them know that by following him there was bound to be divisions. He admonished those on the road trip with him to strive to enter through the narrow door.

As he draws closer to Jerusalem the potential for conflict increases; a conflict of wills greater than children taunting one another in the back of a minivan; the will of the Pharisees and the religious elite, the will of the government officials, the will of the Messiah, and the will of Jerusalem. The Pharisees want to maintain their status and their authority. The governmental officials are concerned that a new king would bring sweeping changes and they might be on the outs. The Messiah has been promised by the prophets of old and signals a new era and a reckoning with past unfaithfulness. And Jerusalem has a checkered past. "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! This is a city that needs a good dose of repentance, confession, and renewing. Even if you aren't aware of the long running history surrounding the city, the word on the street is that it needs redemption.

Anna the prophet said as much when Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the Temple for presentation. Anna praised God when she saw the Christ child; she knew that he was the one to redeem Jerusalem. And if you need to be redeemed, then somehow or other you haven't made it through the narrow door or you have been in a looming downward spiral leading toward conflict and angst. Jesus is on his way to rectify the situation. He has work to do. In the movie sound track of *The Incredibles*, this is where the music changes and Mr. Incredible starts working out, lifting heavy objects, running and miraculously transformed his body image, one that will look swell in his super hero red spandex costume! There is work to do.

The Pharisees pull Jesus aside and clue him to the fact that the political leader Herod wants him killed! A conflict of wills ensues. The political leadership is fearful. Herod has been afraid since the word about a new born king made its way to the palace. Now that the baby has become a man, the threat to his power is magnified. And this threat is making his way toward the city. Jesus delivers a message to the Pharisees "go tell that fox" Herod (that is biblical language for words you aren't allowed to say in church) that he has work to do. Jesus won't be pulled away from his mission. He knows too well the history of Jerusalem. And he acknowledges his desire to redeem, save, rescue, gather its inhabitants into God's protection and acknowledges their unwillingness to do so. How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and yet you were not willing!"

Helen Ann must have been about 12 years of age when she began to raise chickens. Eggs weren't anywhere near a dollar a piece then. And the avian flu was not in the headlines. It was her first experience as an entrepreneur. She made a business plan, calculated the startup costs and the reoccurring expenses. Because of her rural location she permitted her hens to have full run of the property by day and she secured them in the coop at night. Such consistent care was part of the business plan. During the days when the chickens roamed freely she would keep a watchful eye over them. When she would see a mother hen hopping frantically across the field attempting to gather her chicks, she knew that a predator was soaring overhead, or craftily waiting in the taller grass. She was aware of the cost if she lost even one chick.

Jesus is aware of the cost. God's desire is that we are all gathered under God's protective wing; God's loving embrace. Jerusalem's unwillingness to be gathered under the wing of a protective hen spoke volumes. The time would come when they would recognize the Messiah riding into the city on a donkey. Then they proclaim "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord." We shout it on Palm Sunday and sing it in the Sanctus each week "Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord" proclaiming the arrival of the long awaited one, the one who will and does redeem us from all that separates us from God and from one another.

Those of us who have been on the Lenten road trip before know full well where we are heading. We know the sound track. We know the annoying behaviors of siblings along the way. We know that the cross looms. Outside of Jerusalem on cross Jesus' arms will be outstretched in love for you and me and all humanity. The costliness of his sacrifice brings us forgiveness, renewal, and a reorientation striving toward the narrow door. We state as much in the confession of sins; "Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name."

Delighting in God's will is a bit like a family road trip; there are fabulous moments and conflictual ones, "Dad, he's poking me again." "She keeps putting her smelly socks in my face!" Delight comes from the assurance that God is with us, like a mothering hen, gathering us together especially in times of danger and uncertainty. Delight, like road trips, isn't synonymous with happy, blissful, ecstatic. Delighting in God's will means that we are aware of our own will, and have checked at the narrow door, as we pass through into his joyful presence. Amen.

### FIRST READING: Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." 2But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" <sup>3</sup>And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir." 4But the word of the LORD came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir." <sup>5</sup>He brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." 6And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

<sup>7</sup>Then he said to him, "I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess." <sup>8</sup>But he said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" <sup>9</sup>He said to him, "Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtledove, and a young pigeon." <sup>10</sup>He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. <sup>11</sup>And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

<sup>12</sup>As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him.

<sup>17</sup>When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. <sup>18</sup>On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, "To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates."

#### GOSPEL: Luke 13:31-35

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to [Jesus], "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." 32He said to them, "Go and tell that fox for me, 'Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. 33 Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem.' 34 Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! 35See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord."
