Special Meeting of the Congregation

Sunday May 4, 2025, at 10:10 AM

Springettsbury Ave. Entrance Doors/windows

The Congregation Council is calling a special meeting of the congregation on Sunday May 4, 2025, at 10:10 AM to act on a proposal recommended by the Property Committee. The meeting will be held in Christ Hall. The proposal is

to replace the Springettsbury entry doors and glass surround with new six-foot-wide doors with insulated glass which would maintain the existing aesthetics of the building. The replacement doors would permit improved egress for those with walkers, wheelchairs, deliveries, and for caskets at funerals. The new entry would also be equipped with a security feature to aid with safety protocol associated with weekday operations especially as it relates to our preschool.

You may be asking why new entrance doors, wasn't that done during the renovation five years ago? That is a very good question. During the renovation we did not make any changes to the exterior physical structure of the building. The permitting process with the City of York was a rather long and expensive process. Not wanting to delay the project further having to receive approval from HARB, we pulled all exterior modifications from the plans. This saved both time and money seven years ago. The doors at the Springettsbury entrance are the original doors with a five-foot opening and single pane glass. Updating them will improve accessibility and will help with energy efficiency.

You may also ask about security. Didn't we install a keypad to operate the interior doors from the vestibule into the Good Shepherd Room? Yes, we did, and that keypad is working as we had planned. What has changed are the increased acts of violence in the community. In our renovation planning we advocated for the exterior doors to remain unlocked during office hours. The thinking now is to have exterior door locks that can be operated from the office. This way only individuals with a church or preschool business to conduct will be granted access to the vestibule. The lock system adds another layer of security.

An additional reason for replacing the doors is that the crash bar mechanism (now about 85 years old) is failing. We retrofitted the crash bar system on the north narthex entrance (playground facing side) several years ago at a cost exceeding \$4,000. The crash bar on the exterior entrance at the elevator is also in need of repair or replacement. That estimate is just under \$11,000. The Property Committee is planning to utilize the crash bar system from the Springettsbury exterior entrance to repair the entrance door at the elevator as a cost saving strategy. The Property Committee is currently gathering information and accessing all the exterior doors and their mechanisms. They will report their findings to the Congregation Council later.

On Sunday, May 4, at 10:10 AM in Christ Hall we will gather for a special meeting regarding the Property Committee proposal. The Finance Committee recommends funding the \$36,800 expense through designated gifts donated in honor or in memory for a two-month period. Any remaining balance would come from the Investment Account at Fulton Bank. The Congregation Council is in favor of the proposal. 



Where Help is Needed

We received grant money to purchase two large white boards where we will post much of the healthy eating ideas.

Spaghetti is asked for by 80% of our shoppers. We serve an average of 75 families each Tuesday. It would be great if we could have enough spaghetti for all 75 families.
