The Feast of Pentecost Sunday, June 8, 2025 9:15 AM

The Feast of Pentecost is always a joyous day in the life of the Church. Pentecost marks the 50th day after the celebration of the Resurrection. In our liturgical celebrations we focus on the powerful reading from the *Acts of the Apostles* with the sending of the Holy Spirit. In that text we hear how the early church responded to God's gift of the Spirit outpoured. In our modern world it is equally important for us to respond to God's gift of the Spirit outpoured and at work among us. In the early Church the people told how much God had done for them. In our daily life it is important that we are telling how much God has done and is doing for us. The Spirit of God is at work. This year we are very much

aware of the renewal that is going on among us. We regularly witness the Sacrament of Holy Baptism! There are lots of other signs too revealing the work of the Holy Spirit among us.

- This year we witnessed seven young men and one young woman confirming their faith in Christ Jesus! Children are present for Children's sermons at both Sunday liturgies!
- The robust attendance at Mid-week Bible study fills the tables in Christ Hall on Wednesday mornings! Guests who worship with us often return seeking to unite with our faith community!
- Regularly people linger after worship engaging in conversation about our life and mission!
- The women's group has resumed meeting.
- A men's group has begun to meet taking on work in support of LWR.
- Vacation Bible School is being conducted in July!
- Tanzanian travelers have ventured out to other congregations sharing the story of how global relationships strengthen faith.
- Conversations regarding sponsoring another Bridge of Hope family are underway.

The Lord's Prayer Traditional and Contemporary

At the Worship and Arts meeting last month time was given over to discuss the version of the Lord's Prayer we use at St. Paul's. The language that we employ in worship strives to be reverent, authentic and add to the beauty of our life together. Pastor Reep revealed that this is the first parish where he did not pivot from the Old English language version to use contemporary English. He did not make the change because there were so many other aspects of congregational life that needed attention. Time has passed. Realizing the blessing of children in our midst for worship, children's sermons, education, Tuesday Create, and catechetical instruction, it is time to pivot and begin learning and using the words of the prayer in modern English. This version is more closely aligned with the Gospel of St. Luke (11:2-4). This is not new to us as we have at various times sung the "Our Father." The musical setting used for more than 50 years in our Lutheran Worship books has utilized contemporary English. In planning summer worship, we will begin singing the text as part of the Sunday liturgy. Included is the contemporary English. It was suggested that we might begin to incorporate it with our daily devotion.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.



With One Voice Hymnal for summer

Following Trinity Sunday, the blue worship book *With One Voice* will be placed in the pews. Along with it there will be a service folder containing the liturgy, texts and music to be used for much of the summer. Worshipers will locate the hymns in the blue book using the numbers printed in the weekly bulletin and placed on the hymn number boards at the front of the church nave. We are trying this for the summer. It may work, it may not. The hope is that we can reduce printing costs and recycling associated with the Sunday Worship folder. Yes, worshipers will receive a weekly bulletin. It will contain the hymn numbers, Prayer of the Day, appointed Psalm, those who are serving, and pertinent announcements. The readings will appear on the back cover just as they always do.



That portion worshipers may take home (think bulletin cover). The hymns will be sung out of the book. The service folders will remain with the blue book and be used week after week. The Worship and Arts Committee recommended this as one way to be better stewards. It may take us a week or two to reacquaint ourselves with using an actual book during Sunday worship.

The Men of St. Paul's invite you to participate in colleting items needed for Lutheran World Relief Personal Care kits. The plan is to collect individual items over the summer months and assemble the kits on the first Sunday in September. Bins will be placed on the front pews of the church nave. Each bin will be clearly marked so



that you may place items needed into the correct bin. At intervals throughout the summer the care kit items will be tallied, and you will be informed as to where we are falling short and what is needed so that on September 7^{th,} we will have enough of each item to prepare and pack kits ready to be delivered to the collection point in Maryland. By keeping the items in the front pews, it will give visual witness to the ongoing need and the wellspring of generosity amongst our members. What follows is the list of items needed. Please place them on your shopping list and begin to seek out the best products at the best price point. When you find a good source for items, share the information with those sitting around you in worship or during the coffee hour to follow. In advance thank you for your time, generosity and support of this project.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended. Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging. Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.

ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging

- ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging
- Please provide new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.

• Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.

• All items should be new and in good condition.



Confirmation Instruction Proposed schedule and time for the 2025/26 academic year

The desire to include all potential students in catechetical instruction means that each year we review what has been done and rethink how instruction

might be provided for the next group of students. The program is geared for students in grades 7 and 8. A few years ago, we moved the instructional period into the Sunday morning rotation as many students had younger siblings who were participating in Sunday school. This permitted families to make one trip to St. Paul's. While it is not the ideal situation for the pastor and an instructional assistant, it made for better family life for the students.

Looking ahead, it seems that scheduling the confirmation ministry later in the day on Sunday may be most beneficial for maximum participation. The 30 hours of instructional time would be spread out over an eightweek session in the fall of 2025 (early October through late November) and a seven-week session in the winter (early January through late February). Currently sessions would occur from 6:00 - 8:00 PM. This schedule provides ample time for instruction, activity and a closing worship component. When held on Sunday morning we often needed to forgo the activity and worship component. Those aspects of the program help tremendously in keeping things lively.

If you have children entering the 7th grade in September, or if you know someone who has a potential student for the catechetical program at St. Paul's please have them contact the church office and enroll them. If for some reason the proposed schedule for the 2025/26 year is not workable for your family also let the office know ASAP so that alternate plans can be considered.

Stewardship Planning Underway 2025/26

Christian stewardship is a vital part of a life of faith. "Where your treasure is there will your heart be also." The Stewardship Committee prays that your heart is deeply rooted in Christ Jesus and his love and mercy for you and for all people. It is no coincidence that the biblical witness is rich with stories about faith, generosity, blessing and life. As we look ahead to the fall of this year the Sunday scripture texts highlight many different aspects of faith and the way stewardship is connected to it; give up possessions and take up the cross, Jesus looking for the lost and welcoming sinners, faithfulness in little things, the rich man and poor Lazarus, faith the size of a mustard seed, a leper who gives thanks, a widow demanding justice from the judge, and prayers of a pharisee and a tax collector. With each story there is a story about stewardship. We are currently at work

planning educational events to highlight aspects of each story. The congregation is encouraged to increase in financial giving and in the giving of time and talent to meet the needs of our growing community. The care and planning of the Stewardship Committee will assist us during the stewardship emphasis this fall.

Where Help is Needed

There are times when people ask how they can help, or what they can do. There are many tasks that are associated with public worship. Those are the most familiar areas of Christian service for the upbuilding of the congregation. However, there are many others.

- We need to train Eucharist Ministers. These are persons who take the consecrated bread and wine from the Sunday Eucharist to members who physically can no longer get to St. Paul's on Sunday morning. We have had many members take an active part in this ministry prior to the pandemic. That is when this ministry came to a sudden stop.
- We need a person to chair the Social Ministry Committee. This role entails forming a group of compassionate outward looking individuals to provide oversight and create pathways in areas of service towards our neighbors, those next doors, down the street or around the world. The Food Pantry falls under Social Ministry. So do things like Jackson Elementary School, LWR, The World Hunger Appeal, LAMPA, Bridge of Hope. The chairperson does not do all the work simply helps to keep us all connected and helps to facilitate any new ways that we, as Christian people, might wish to serve our neighbors.
- We need people willing to serve on the Stewardship Committee. The Committee has strong support with two members of Congregation Council and the Pastor serving. The committee is responsible for an annual appeal. This is more than raising financial resources. This helps us as Christian people to examine how we utilize the gift of time, talent and money. All three are important for the up building of the congregation and for extending the gracious reign of God.


