The Season of Advent Begins Sunday 30 November Season of Hope and Expectation

Sunday 30 November ushers in a new liturgical year with the First Sunday of Advent. With the new liturgical year comes a lectionary grounded in the Gospel of Matthew. Matthew has a preoccupation with righteousness. Matthew helps us by revealing from whom true righteousness comes. When you join in worship, expect to hear the story of God's love told with elegance, bold



imagery, and a review of what was stated in the Hebrew Scriptures. This is a season which brings hope, not only for people of faith, but as the angles proclaim; "News of great joy for all people!" Our Advent worship will be shaped by the joy which comes to us and is given to us by God's only Son, Christ Jesus.

Advent Wednesdays Dinner and Vespers

On the three Wednesdays in Advent we will have a simple fellowship meal at 6:00 PM in Christ Hall followed by Vespers in the Church Nave at 7:00 PM. By setting aside this time for Christian fellowship and prayer you will add another way to observe this holy season. If you would like to contribute to the items needed for the meal please add your name to the sign-up sheet located in the Good Shepherd Room. The vesper liturgy adds a particular calm to what can be a hectic season. Join us for fellowship and prayer.



The Nativity of Our Lord Christmas Eve 4:00 and 7:00 PM

The Christmas Eve services will be held at 4:00 and 7:00 PM on Wednesday, December 24. The liturgies will be slightly different based on the choir personnel and those in attendance. Last year we experienced an overwhelming participation at 4:00 PM by families and young children. With that knowledge the Worship and Arts Committee and the music staff has planned for elegant musical expressions announcing the Lord's birth in Bethlehem at both service times. There will be carols, preaching and Holy



Communion at both services. Music and Create is a program designed for our families with young children to engage in music and art while also having the opportunity


to connect with other families. The program is designed for children ages 3 through grade 6. We split the children into two age groups, age 3 through grade 1 and grade 2 through grade 6.



2026 Flower Chart


