Holy Week Schedule and Liturgical Notes

Palm /Passion Sunday

March 29, 2026 9:30 AM

We begin Holy Week by observing Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion on March 29. The entire morning is given over to this important day in the life of Christian faith. The worship schedule has been altered to bring us all together for this important day in our lives of Christian faith. The 9:30 AM liturgy begins with a procession with palm branches. The traditional hymn “All Glory Laud and Honor” will be sung as the procession makes its way around the church nave. The Chancel Choir and Children’s choirs will render anthems fitting for the day. The liturgy quickly changes tone to a more somber character as we hear the Prayer of the Day and move immediately to the readings assigned for the Sunday of the Passion. The service of the word culminates with the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Matthew. Holy Communion will be celebrated. Palm branches will be available for worshipers to take home.



Please plan to participate in the combined Palm/Passion Sunday liturgy. And do invite a friend or family member to come with you to worship as we enter into this most holy of weeks in Christian faith.

York Conference Holy Week Vespers

Monday, March 30, 2026 7:00 PM -Hosted by St. Paul’s Lutheran Church

The York Conference pastors and deacons are holding a combined time of worship for all congregations of the conference on the Monday of Holy Week, March 30th at 7:00 PM. The liturgy features readings from the Old Testament and the Epistles. A joint choir will render an anthem based on the familiar text, “Jesus the very thought of you.” A time of fellowship will follow in the Good Shepherd Room.

The Rite of Confession and Forgiveness—With Individual Absolution

Wednesday of Holy Week—April 1, 2026 7:00 PM

On Holy Wednesday a liturgy of confession and forgiveness provides opportunity for us to hear again God’s word of forgiveness made known to us through the suffering death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. Pastor Tom McKee will be the preacher for this confession service. Following the confession, time is provided for worshipers to come forward and receive the laying on of hands and individual absolution. This service prepares us to enter into the solemn Three Days; Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

Maundy Thursday—April 2, 2026 7:00 PM

We begin the solemn Three Days with the liturgy on Maundy Thursday. It begins with the sermon. This is a rather jarring beginning from our traditional liturgical pattern. We do this in order that the sermon provides direction and insight into the events of the solemn three days. We will hear of the new commandment given to us by our Lord Jesus *That we love one another* through the Gospel reading from St. John. We will recall how the supper was instituted by Christ himself and how the Apostle Paul handed it on to the Church in Corinth and through time to us. The liturgy concludes with the “stripping of the Altar,” removing everything from the chancel in preparation for the solemnity of Good Friday. While the chancel appointments are being removed, the cantor and congregation sing Psalm 22. The service ends in complete silence. There is not a benediction as this is one part of a liturgy extending over three days.



Good Friday—April 3, 2026 7:00 PM

On Good Friday the focus of our liturgical life centers on the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ from the Gospel of St. John. The prayers are in the form of a spoken litany and we conclude with the Reproaches of the Cross. The veil is removed from large wooden cross as we acknowledge that it is upon the hard wood of the cross that our Savior bore the sin of the world. Worshipers are invited to reverence the cross as they take their leave from the sanctuary. Once again, there is no benediction as this is the second part of a liturgy extending over three days.



Holy Saturday/Vigil of Easter with Sacrament of Holy Baptism April 4, 2026 7:00 PM

The Great Vigil of Easter is one of the most important liturgies in Christianity. Here we hear how God through time has brought Salvation to humankind and how our Lord Jesus passes from death to life. We begin at the Garden of Memory on the south lawn. A new fire is kindled and from it the Paschal candle is lighted. We process into the church nave and take candle light from the Paschal candle spreading its flame to the hand candles of worshipers as the Easter Proclamation is sung by the cantor. Then we sit.

The daylight fades in the worship space as we hear readings from scripture. There are 12 appointed readings telling of salvation history, how God through time reaches to save and rescue humankind from sin and death. This year seven readings have been selected. These seven readings give shape to our understanding of God's work in history from creation through the Prophet Daniel.

Hand candles are once again lighted for the Baptismal portion of the liturgy. This year there are candidates for Holy Baptism so the assembly enters into the Baptismal rite. In the quiet beauty of darkness and flickering candle light, the sacrament of Holy Baptism is celebrated. Then, all gathered are invited to renew their baptismal promises with Affirmation of Baptism. A hymn focusing our attention on Baptism is sung. The candles are extinguished and in the darkened church building we pray the Litany.

Then suddenly the morning light of Easter breaks in as we sing an Easter hymn in the brilliance of an illuminated church nave. Spring flowers appear in the church. Dazzling white paraments grace the pulpit and altar. The account of the Resurrection of Our Lord from St. John is read. The Peace is shared. Servers prepare the altar for the first celebration of Easter, and Holy Communion is celebrated. The liturgy that has extended over three days concludes with the Easter Proclamation; *Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!* Then we gather in the Good Shepherd Room for a reception, celebrating the joy of the Easter proclamation and those who are newly baptized.



The Resurrection of Our Lord, Easter Day April 5, 2026 9:30 AM

One combined liturgy on Sunday morning will make our Easter joy and celebration complete. A glorious prelude stirs us for the Festival Liturgy. The Church nave and chancel will be beautifully appointed with spring flowers. The Chancel Choir will lead us in the liturgy and hymns. The Handbell Choir will ring a beautiful anthem. We will use *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* musical setting #1 for the liturgy. The Easter Day liturgy is straight forward following the tradition form of the mass. The sermon will announce the good news that God has acted bringing us life and salvation. Following the liturgy the Fellowship Committee is providing light refreshments. Please plan to come. Invite friends and family members to join you, especially those who may not have a church home. May your joy be full and may Easter provide you with renewed hope.

On the last Sunday in April we host the preschool children and their families during worship at the 10:30 AM liturgy. However the day will begin with an 8:30 AM liturgy followed by breakfast in the Fellowship Hall at 9:30 AM. The men of St. Paul's are preparing the breakfast for the day. We have extended an invitation to our preschool families so that they have an opportunity to get acquainted with us, members and friends of St. Paul's. The men will be collecting for their Lutheran World Relief project so please come prepared to make a donation. Then we will feature the preschool children singing many of their chapel songs with Pastor Reep during the 10:30 AM liturgy. Following the late service The Mpuguso Committee is holding a bake sale (historically held on Mother's Day weekend but moved up two weeks this year) to help with the completion of their church's youth and Sunday school areas. This day is one in which we experience the children as they make music singing praise to God and share the story of God's enduring presence with us through his Word and Holy Supper. This is a full morning. The hope is that preschool families visiting for the preschool Sunday component will be able to experience a fuller expression of the congregation through fellowship and mission activities.

Sunday school for Children during the month of April (No fooling)!

April 12 The children will learn about our congregation and how we are part of the global church through our York Conference, The Lower Susquehanna Synod, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and the Lutheran World Federation. Experimental Trial Worship Time—Through May 17, 2026

The Hopes of this Experiment are:

- Increase attendance by moving from 8:00 AM and starting at 8:30 AM. This may be appealing to families who regularly move out the door shortly after 8:00 AM during the week. This eliminates a half hour wait between Sunday worship and Sunday school. While the education time is scheduled at 9:15 AM the reality is that folks arrive at 9:30 AM. Worshipers can move directly from worship to Christian Education.
- Increase available parking for the 10:30 AM liturgy. By making the early worship time a bit more appealing for schedules this has the potential of freeing up parking spaces for those who arrive later in the morning. The 10:30 AM liturgy is often the time when we experience individuals and families visiting St. Paul's having more parking options would be beneficial. Currently 8:00 AM averages 35 and 10:30 AM averages 125.
- By evening out the participants across two service times, we increase the potential number of people available to serve. This will ease the burden of leadership roles currently experienced at the early service time.
- When there are 70 or more people in the church the energy in the room changes. This is most noticeable for the preaching task, both for the one preaching and for those who listen. The acoustics in the room change.

After significant deliberation the Council decided on **an experimental trial worship time of 8:30 AM (moving the 8:00 AM liturgy one half hour) will continue through May 17th**. This will provide a time to hear responses, see if we are moving toward the desired hopes, and have time to plan accordingly for the 2026-2027 academic year. **The start time of the second liturgy will remain at 10:30 AM.**

Wednesday Morning 10:30 AM

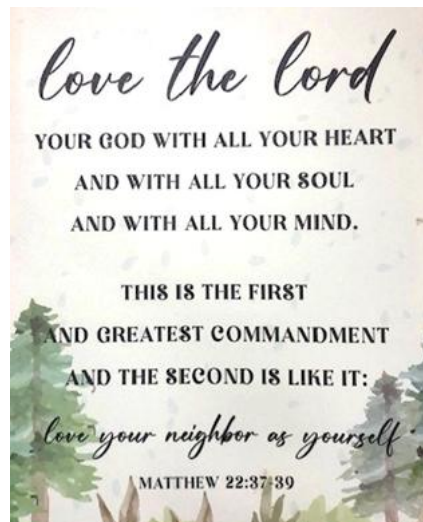

St. Paul's Food Pantry

This sign hangs in St. Paul's Food Pantry as a witness to why we open our doors week after week to provide food for neighbors in need. Thank you to the many people in this parish who, for over 40 years, have offered their time and money to serve our neighbors. Our pantry is run with more than 30 volunteers.

From 2020 through 2025 the number of families coming for food has grown. Recently some federal feeding programs have been cut or greatly reduced. The cost of food has increased from our two main sources, Central Penn Food Bank and York County Food Bank. SNAP benefits have recently changed. All of this means that running a pantry like ours is a bit more financially challenging.



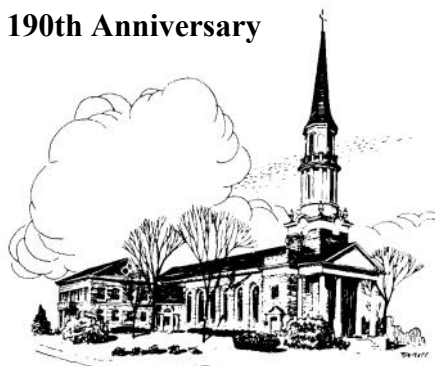
During December, January and February the number of families coming has decreased. We do not know why. We do not know if the numbers will remain as they are or if they will increase again this spring. We do know that the cost for food that the church will spend has increased from last year.

190th Anniversary



St. Paul's Lutheran Church is celebrating a meaningful milestone in 2026—our 190th anniversary as a congregation. As part of honoring this historic occasion, we are undertaking a special project to recognize the legacy of our founding pastor, Jonathan Oswald.

Pastor Oswald played a central role in the early life of our church, and his family's burial plot at Prospect Hill Cemetery stands as an important reminder of our congregation's roots. To honor his contribution and celebrate the church's long history, a planning committee has begun organizing a restoration and beautification effort for the Oswald family cemetery plot.

This project will include cleaning and resetting headstones, along with other improvements designed to respectfully restore the site and ensure it reflects the dignity and history of the individuals buried there. Our goal is to have this work completed in time to rededicate the cemetery plot in October 2026.
