

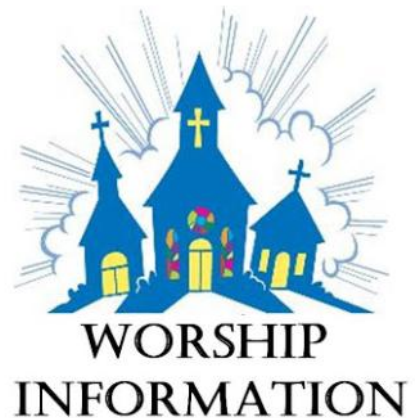

Fall Worship & Education Schedule set by Congregation Council **9:30 AM The Holy Eucharist, 10:45 AM Faith Formation (Sunday School)**

The Congregation Council at their meeting on the 20th of July voted to permanently continue with the summer worship service time of 9:30 AM with education to follow at 10:45 PM. This decision was not entered into lightly. Many things were taken into consideration. At this juncture we have moved forward with what had been planned for the spring of 2020 prior to the COVID 19 pandemic. We thank everyone who provided feedback and especially to the Worship and Arts Committee and the Christian Education Committee for their work to sustain our life together through worship and faith formation.



We are delighted to add to our ministry staff The Rev. Daniel Yeiser. Pastor Yeiser will be providing pastoral care through visitation. The current arrangement has Pastor Yeiser working part-time on Wednesdays. We thank the Mutual Ministry Committee for their work in preparing for additional staffing hours, to the Congregation Council for their final approval, and to the congregation for recognizing this need and acting during the 2025 Annual Meeting last November. Called for service, peace, instruction & renewal Stewardship Emphasis

In the sacrament of Holy Baptism, we are called to be God's Holy people in the world. We are called to serve God and neighbor, to speak peace, gain knowledge through instruction and work for renewal in the church. The church's calendar of saints is a rich resource for people whose lives reflected these aspects of Christian life. During the four weeks leading up to our "Thank You" Dinner on Wednesday 7 October 2026 at 5:30 PM, we will hear something about four saints of God;

1. John Chrysostom, Bishops of Constantinople 407 AD
2. Dag Hammarskjöld, peacemaker 1961 AD
3. Jerome, translator & teacher 420 AD
4. Francis of Assisi, renewer of the Church 1226 AD

Four Temple Talks will be prepared for presentation during worship on Sundays; 13, 20 & 27 September and 4 October. The Temple Talks will provide background as to how each child of God lived into their calling. By their example we will attempt to instill in our own faith community the importance of stewarding the gifts that have been entrusted to us. To provide further opportunity to learn about these servants of God the adult education time will focus each week on the designated individual.

A Thank You Dinner will be held on Wednesday 7 October 2026, beginning at 5:30 PM and will include a menu for children and a menu for adults. The menus will be provided in the next issue of *Our Church*. You will be asked to make reservations so that we can prepare accordingly.

Stewardship materials (2027 envelopes, Commitment Cards, Step chart, giving trends, Time and Ability forms) will be made available that evening. We are planning to present all the important aspects of the stewardship emphasis this year in a skit featuring our own church members. The skits are planned to be light-hearted and entertaining. We want this to be a family night out and one that will be memorable. We are currently assembling a cast, so contact the office as quickly as possible to be included!

The Stewardship materials will be returned on Reformation Sunday, 25 October or All Saints Sunday, 1 November. The emphasis should help us become more faithful in our daily living; being neighbor, promoting peace, participating in learning opportunities, and renewing the Church through many aspects of mission and ministry being made known to us through congregation, conference, synod, national church and Lutheran World Federation and partners like LWR. Please pray for St. Paul's congregation and leadership as we embark on the 2026/27 Stewardship Campaign.

Congregation Council Highlights

The Congregation Council met for their regular monthly meeting on 20 July at 6:30 PM. The meeting began with devotion and prayer.

Treasurer Ken Hinkle presented his report for the month of June. It was noted that Pastor Yeiser has begun his work with us as part-time hourly visitation pastor. At this point it appears that we are on budget for the year. Both offerings and anticipated income are in line with expenses.

The council took up old business regarding the worship schedule for St. Paul's and the feedback following the trial period held in the spring and the 9:30 AM summer worship schedule. The council approved that beginning on 13 September we will extend the 9:30 AM Sunday Worship time followed by Education (Sunday school) at 10:45 AM through the end to the calendar year. During this extended time the Christian Education Committee will be asked to monitor participation in Sunday school, the Worship & Arts Committee will be asked to monitor worship and participation by the faith community. Additionally, ways to identify parking, especially for guests, families and elderly will be sought out to ease that aspect of accessing St. Paul's.

All committees need to complete their budget requests and submit them to the Finance Committee so that they can begin their work at their August meeting. This is a very short turn around time but must be honored so that council receives a first draft of the budget at their 21 September meeting.

The work of renewing the cemetery plot of the founding Pastor of St. Paul's has reached the point where there is financial expense associated with the project. It was moved to utilize \$7,046 from the Memorial Fund to secure the items needed to restore the cemetery plot at Prospect Hill in preparation for its rededication on 11 October 2026.

Following up from the special meeting held on 16 July with Bishop Herr, Pastor Martini, Mutual Ministry and Council, a draft proposal for a succession plan for a Senior Pastor will be prepared by the Executive Committee and presented at the August meeting for additional input. Following the preparation and approval of that document by the synod office a current Congregation Profile will be completed and names and biographies of members who may wish to serve on a Call Committee will be gathered. An official form will be prepared for inclusion with the September newsletter for anyone wishing to be considered for membership of the Call Committee. Anyone interested will submit information in the same manner. From that pool of names Council will select 6 names and one alternate to comprise the Call Committee. We anticipate this work to be complete in time for inclusion with the Annual Meeting 15 November.

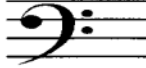

Succession Planning for Pastoral Leadership at St. Paul's Lutheran Church

Two years ago, the Congregation Council surveyed the congregation regarding skills and talents desired for the next pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church. This was done at the encouragement of Pastor Reep. His desire was to have the congregation complete the required congregation profile while we were not under any duress which often occurs following a pastoral vacancy. That began a process to assist St. Paul's as we discern a successor for Pastor Reep. Then, Nicki Herdson was serving as Council President. She prepared an executive summary from the responses provided by congregation members. It came as no surprise that we highly value; preaching, worship planning and leadership, Bible study, the climate of welcome that exists at St. Paul's and the administrative skills that keep things in good order.



SUCCESSION PLANNING

This past April, Kem Vaught, Mutual Ministry Chair, Pastor Reep and I sat down with Bishop Herr and talked with him about a succession plan for St. Paul's. The idea was to avoid a long pastoral vacancy when the time comes for Pastor Reep to retire. We suggested that this might look different from what congregations have experienced for generations when a pastor retires. To that end, the Congregation Council and the Mutual Ministry Committee along with Pastor Reep met with Bishop Herr and his Assistant, Pastor Beth Martini, on Thursday evening 16 July, for a preliminary conversation.

Bishop Herr listened attentively as members of the Council and Mutual Ministry shared hopes and dreams for the congregation. We in turn listened as the bishop shared possible scenarios of how the next Senior Pastor of St. Paul's might be selected while Pastor Reep continues to serve the congregation until such time as a newly called pastor is ready to begin. While we are not eager to have Pastor Reep retire, he is eager for St. Paul's to embark on the next chapter of life and ministry and to make the process as smooth as possible. A clear process with expectations will need to be established and observed. This will be the work of the Congregation Council. In the next few weeks, we will work on a written succession plan for St. Paul's. It will be shared with the bishop for approval and then it will be made available to you so that the process is transparent.

At this point in time we will continue to move forward with all the energy and enthusiasm for mission and ministry that has become central to our life together. I do ask that you pray for Bishop Herr and his staff, the Congregation Council and Mutual Ministry Committee members, and Pastor Reep, as together they work to move the St. Paul's Lutheran Congregation into the second century of Gospel ministry.

Choirs Forming Opportunities for music making at St. Paul's

Over this past summer we have discovered many musically talented individuals within the congregation. For that gift we rejoice! We also discovered that when asked and encouraged to do so the congregation will indeed sing. During the sabbatical of our parish organist, we have become more confident independent music makers. Which brings renewed hope to our choir program at St. Paul's.



The Children's Choir rehearses on Tuesday evenings, in conjunction with Create, are held from 6:00-7:15 PM. The group is divided between the younger preschool children and the older elementary children. They sing, ring handbells and tone chimes, play Orff instruments, and add percussion to enhance our public worship. Their enthusiasm and joy bring delight to Sunday and Holiday worship.

The Handbell Choir rehearsal is held on Thursday evenings from 6:30-7:30 PM. The ensemble rings about once a month on Sunday and at most holidays. The group is comprised of students in middle and high school through adults. To ring all four octaves of handbells we need individuals who can lift the large heavy bells. The choir personnel have remained relatively stable through the last several years. This year we have three high school seniors who will be leaving their positions as they embark on university study. If you are interested in ringing or for additional information regarding the ensemble, please contact Leah McComas the director.

The Chancel Choir has remained a staple at St. Paul's. Through time this group has diminished in number. This limits the repertoire possible for the Sunday liturgy. The Chancel Choir gathers for rehearsal on Thursday at 7:30 PM. The ability to commit to every Thursday evening has become challenging for choir members. We are discussing other options and possibilities that may increase participation and better steward the musical talent within the congregation. Please know that you do not need to be a strong confident singer, or read music perfectly, or even know which part better suits your vocal range. The most important reason that we gather is for the shared experience of music making in praise of God's great love made known to us through Christ Jesus. If you would like additional information on the Chancel Choir, please speak with Victor Fields the director. We are eager to welcome you and your voice to the musical tapestry at St. Paul's.

Catechetical Instruction Begins Sunday September 13

The desire to include all potential students in catechetical instruction means that each year we review what has been done and rethink how instruction might be provided for the next group of students. This year catechetical instruction will follow the late service. We will share a simple lunch and then move directly into time for instruction with the sessions concluding at 2:00 PM. The roughly 30 hours of instructional time will be spread out over a nine-week session in the fall (September 13 – November 8) and a ten-week session in the winter (January 10 – March 14) with confirmation being observed on The Second Sunday of Easter, April 4, 2027. This schedule provides ample time for instruction, activity and a closing worship component.



If you have children entering the 7th grade in September, or if you know someone who has a potential student for the catechetical program at St. Paul's please have them contact the church office and enroll them. If for some reason the proposed schedule for the 2026/27 year is not workable for your family also let the office know ASAP so that alternate plans can be considered.

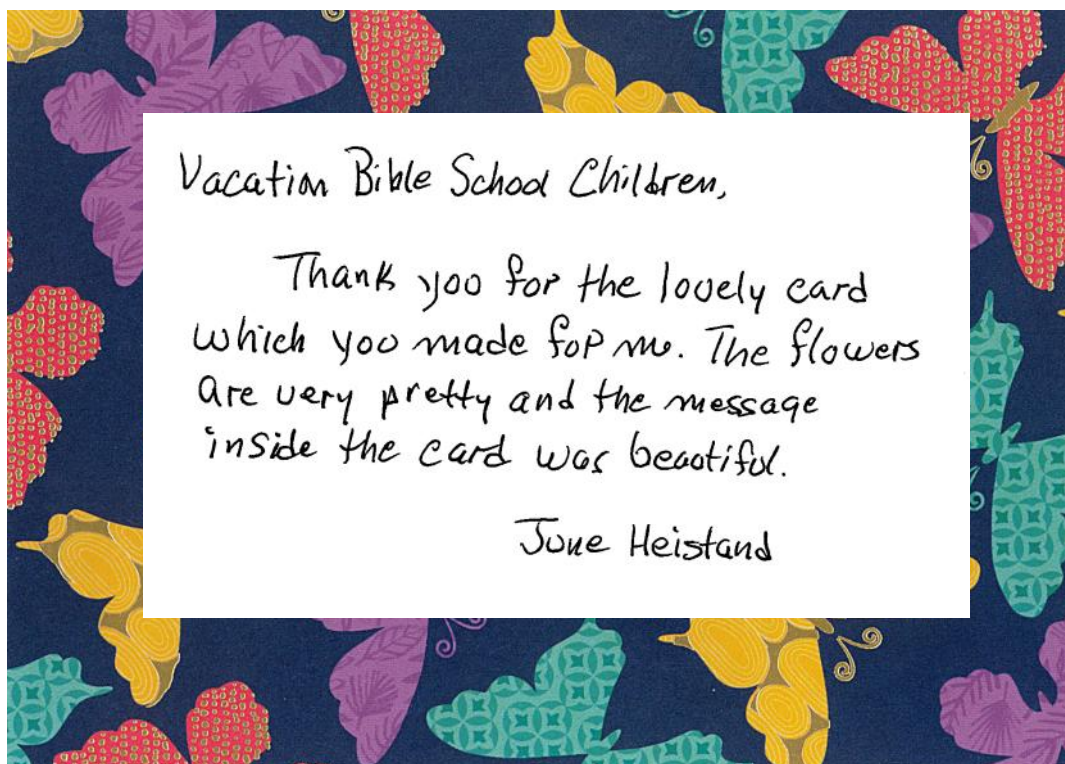
